DMHAS Crisis Services Presentation	 Mobile Crisis Services 18 statewide teams (some DMHAS operated). Services are mobile, readily accessible, rapid response, and short-term for adults experiencing a mental health, substance-use, or co-occurring crisis. Availability of in-person response varies across the state. 90% of 2019 adults received a referral to ongoing interventions. ACTION Line Services Offers statewide 24/7 centralized crisis call center (telephonic support) for adults experiencing an emotional crisis needing an immediate response. Crisis Intervention Teams (CIT)/Training CIT model training is available to law enforcement and behavioral health personnel Provides knowledge and resources to connect adults experiencing crisis with supports and services Diverts adults from arrest, incarceration, and hospitalization. Collaboration with Mobile Crisis and Law enforcement Some clinicians do ride-alongs with law enforcement some carry a police radio, or some are embedded with law enforcement There is regular communication, review of data, and training. 	 Sandra will connect presenters to parole to do presentation. Sub-committee should consider the opportunity to partner with DMHAS, mobile crisis services, and law enforcement to review and provide training to law enforcement.

	 Quarterly CIT coordinators, clinicians, and DMHAS participate in learning collaboratives. Data-Next Steps In June 2021, 4,685 substance use related calls and 4,490 mental health related calls were received. Data around racial inequities related to access, outcomes, and implications of mobile crisis interventions will be explored and enhanced. Data will be reviewed taking into consideration the current continuum of services. Gaps and challenges have been identified (lack of stabilization beds, inperson response, etc.). Training and collaborations will be continued and enhanced.
