DOC Re-Entry Services	DOC re-entry services assist offenders in their transition back to the community in the following areas: employment, housing/placement, transportation, veteran services, family reunification, identification cards and documents, and access to healthcare. State issued IDs may be issued prior to discharge by DMV office on DOC site. Offenders are also connected with Re-Entry Centers prior to release. Re-entry services collaborate with addiction/mental health/medical services, public safety, probation, community outreach, and friends/family to assist in the transition. Re-entry services staff also attend community roundtables.	
CSSD Rapid Re-Housing Initiative	CSSD and the Department of Housing have a collaboration to use a rapid housing model. The initiative, currently in New Haven, helps homeless and unstably housed clients who are compliant with probation. The rapid housing model helps them get leases, documents, and rent subsidies. Participants pay 0-60% of their income in rent. Hartford clients will have access in November/December 2021. There are no probation penalties if clients decline the service.	

	CSSD developed a screener in CMS and housing survey. It
