2.	Response to Fake Prescription Pills	New website: One pill can kill - One Pill Can Kill - Toolbox DEA.gov Discussion of DEA public safety document about the increase in fake prescription pills containing fentanyl and methamphetamine.	Abby and Ramona will send out the video to the group.	
		Abby Alter and Ramona Anderson (DPH) shared with the group some creatives made for both digital and print, will be approved and sent around soon. They were also able to share a 30 second video ad on fake pills, targeted toward the general community. It received approval and will go out to local health departments to use and post. Members provided positive feedback on the video and emphasized the importance of this work right now. Members also discussed wanting to see the video in Spanish too. Counterfeit pills (M-30; oxycodone) are being seen frequently in the community, these are little blue pills. It was suggested pills that look similar could be shown in these ads.
