Quarterly Federal Grant Updates	 Strategic Prevention Framework for Prescription Drugs (SPF-Rx 2021): 5-year grant awarded to DMHAS from SAMHSA ending 9/29/2026. Focus on student learning program – "Adopt a Health District," workforce development, data collection and analysis. Beginning in Fall 2022, Adopt a Health District will place UConn MPH and Pharmacy students in health districts to build capacity locally and strengthen the public health workforce. Data: SEOW will use PDMP data to inform the project. State Opioid Response (SOR) – update provided for Feb/Mar prevention initiatives only. Funding for two years ending 9/29/22. The purpose of the funding is to provide education & awareness, workforce & outreach to reduce opioid overdose deaths. Change the Script campaign analytics were shared showing an increase number of users to website. Mobile Resource Van events reached 600 people. 48 mini-grants awarded to community coalitions. 3 Radio PSA's, 3 digital and 1 static billboard, 12 community-level billboard posters targeting older adults/seniors, 44 transit and podcast ads thru iHeart radio. some audiences are downloading the e-book and distributing it separately. Guiding Document for Schools also available through SERC. United Way is distributing lockboxes. Presentation describing lockboxes as a suicide prevention strategy is available for download. CPES continues evaluation activities. Overdose prevention and harm reduction: RBHAOS are doing Narcan/Nalaxone training and distribution. Academic detailing continues – 5th module completed. 135 pharmacists or prescribers will have participated by 7/31. Exit interviews are being conducted that are identifying gaps to be addressed, particularly around training. Training & workforce: college mini-grants. 784 Naloxone kits distributed, reached 1471 individuals through workshops. • <u>OD2A grant</u>: Overdose Data to Action, CDC grant to DPH. Focus on understanding and tracking overdoses, integrate data into prevention. Using two types of strategies: surveillance strategies (monitor non-fatal overdoses using EMS and SWORD data; monitoring fatal overdoses via OCME) and prevention strategies (better utilize PDMP data, state & local integration of prevention efforts with a focus on high burden areas, linkage to care - e.g., SBIRT, provider and health systems support - e.g., safe prescribing, partnerships with public safety and first responders, peer-to-peer learning). Data is being shared with local health departments for their use. Every state has seen an increase in overdoses during 2020-2021. Hispanic and African American/Black populations have been greatly affected by overdose. Most deaths happening in households. The OD2A national meeting focused on increasing access to Naloxone, MOUD, and mental health. • ASSERT: the grant is in the final 3 months of the no-cost extension period. During previous quarter the grant completed the following activities: Hosted 2 workforce development workshops (Adolescent ASAM workshop for providers, and Cannabis in CT); continued with final webpage modifications to launch the Assessment Intervention Matching (AIM) online tool anticipated 8/1; GAIN-Q4 clinical reports and assessment content moved into production.
