

York CI

 Dissolving methadone tablets for 100+ women daily

Vendor run programs

- meeting capacity
- Maintenance only
- Transporting large number of methadone doses daily

- Security levels

Governor assigned 8 million over 2 years, then followed by 6 million following year




Vendor-based

• 10 MOUD treatment programs

Treating ~ 850-875 inmate-patients daily (methadone/buprenorphine/naltrexone)

MOUD System--2019

- Treat ~ 200 patients daily
- Largely methadone
 - buprenorphine at YCI
- 6 Facility-based programs
 - 1-Internal OTP
 - 5-vendor-based OTPs
