Medication for Alcohol Use Disorder Priority 1	Sandrine sent an email about hosting educational seminars asking for suggested speakers and panelists from a variety of sectors. What are we required to do?</li> <li>Need to see if anyone is researching impact of MJ use in combination with other substances to better understand how to keep patients safe. Since it is a Schedule 1 drug, and not able to be studied with Federal funds, little research is available re: US populations.</li> <li>Lit Search Questions: Implication for TX providers, Implications for harm reduction</li> </ul>	Luiza will bring this question back to the State Partners call where all committees are represented and are tasked with roles. Should we have a uniform name? Doing so would be consistent with harm reduction/public health strategies.
