Subject: DMHAS COVID-19 Staff Update #9

Since the Governor announced the first positive case of COVID-19 in a Connecticut nearly three weeks ago, nearly 900 additional state residents have tested positive for the virus. It is expected that we will see an increase in the number of COVID-19 cases across the state, including throughout the DMHAS system.

As part of the agency's response to the COVID-19 outbreak, DMHAS has identified spaces in each state-operated facility to be used to care for individuals who require isolation based on suspected or confirmed COVID-19 virus. "Isolation" is the term used when separating a patient who is showing symptoms or is known to have COVID-19 from patients who are well. "Quarantine" is the term used to separate patients who have been exposed to COVID-19, but are not showing symptoms and are being monitored for signs of illness. As this is an evolving situation, these plans are fluid and subject to change dependent on a number of factors including acuity, patient needs, staffing levels, etc. For information on the designated isolation space in your facility, please contact your facility CEO.
