Block Grant updates

FFY24 Block Grant budget

- FFY24 Block Grant allocations to states will be the same as FFY23 (flat funding)
- FFY24 Federal Budget included cuts to may programs but Block Grants were kept level with FFY23
- DMHAS will maintain existing spending plan based on FFY23
- Allocation plan for both the MHBG and SUBG will remain the same as last year

Total FFY24 award: \$9,794,675

- Adult Mental Health Services: \$6,067,889
- Children's Mental Health Services: \$3,726,786
