## Legislative Update # 1 January 22, 2021

Welcome to a most unusual legislative session! Since the session falls on an odd-numbered year, it will be a "long" session and will last five months. Due to the pandemic, this session will be conducted virtually, at least for the first few months. This means hearings will be conducted via Zoom, and to watch all the action that occurs at the Capitol during hearings or sessions of the House and Senate we all must tune into YouTube or <a href="CT-N">CT-N</a>. Information on how to watch the proceedings will be available on the <a href="Legislative Calendar">Legislative Calendar</a>. I will make every effort to use these updates to help keep you informed as bills move through the legislative process.

Over the last week, there have been legislative proposals that may impact the behavioral health community. These proposals are largely "concepts," which means the full language of the bill is not available but the underlying purpose of the bill is published.

To date, we are tracking quite a few of these concepts and looking forward to expanded language related to them. The following legislative proposals may be of interest:
