Legislative Update #3 March 16, 2023

The DMHAS legislative team is happy to share the information below related to bill of note to the behavioral health community.

<u>HB-6562</u> AN ACT CONCERNING TELEHEALTH. Heard in Public Health on 2/22/2023. Voted out of Committee and pending on the House calendar.

<u>HB-6600</u> AN ACT CONCERNING FUNDING FOR REGIONAL BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ACTION ORGANIZATIONS. Heard in Public Health on 2/22/2023, referred to the Appropriations Committee

Opioid Settlement Money bills of interest.

<u>PA 22-48</u> Provided a structure for the approval and distribution of opioid settlement money via a multistakeholder Opioid Settlement Advisory Council. Several bills have been introduced in reference to the settlement dollars. They are:

SB-176 AN ACT CONCERNING THE USE OF OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDS.

<u>HB-5315</u> AN ACT CONCERNING THE USE OF FUNDING FROM THE OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUND TO BE USED TO SUPPLY A PATIENT WHO HAS BEEN PRESCRIBED AN OPIOID DRUG WITH A PERSONAL-USE PHARMACEUTICAL DISPOSAL SYSTEM.

HB-5869 AN ACT CONCERNING THE UTILIZATION OF THE OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUND.

<u>HB-6696</u> AN ACT CONCERNING THE OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUND AND PERSONAL OPIOID DRUG DEACTIVATION AND DISPOSAL PRODUCTS.

<u>HB-6718</u> AN ACT CONCE RNING THE SAFE STORAGE AND DISPOSAL OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS, CANNABIS AND CANNABIS PRODUCTS.

<u>HB-6698</u> AN ACT CONCERNING DRUG POLICY, SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND PEER SUPPORT SERVICES AND MANDATORY MINIMUM SENTENCES FOR CERTAIN DRUG-RELATED CRIMES.
