At the start of each legislative session, each state agency brings forth a list of agency proposals to their committee of cognizance. These proposals can vary from updating outdated statutes to implementing new guidelines on an existing program to initiating new programs. It is then up to Committee Leadership if they want to move forward and draft these proposals.




What's Next and Legislative Resources
