This is a follow up to the November 2016 DMHAS memo which announced a pilot allowing providers to accumulate and access a "bank" of unused bed days accrued from July 1, 2016 forward. This "bank" allowed providers to go over their daily DMHAS contracted capacity (if their license allowed) once their accrued unused bed days met or exceeded their average length of stay for the specific program, based on paid claims. Each program at each level of care accrues its own bank of unused days. The pilot began on November 14, 2016.

DMHAS and ABH are pleased to announce that this initiative will be repeated in the new state fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2017. Beginning on July 1, 2017, providers will again begin to accrue a "bank" of unused days for each specific program based on FY18 paid claims.

Please note the bank is based on claims data using a two-month lag, not authorization data. All bank balances accrued during FY17 (July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017) will be eliminated on June 30, 2017 and new banks will be established. In other words, each bank balance is limited to the fiscal year in which it was accrued. Starting July 1, 2017, there will be a 2-month waiting period until banks accumulate "new" unused bed days.
