

Clinic Based Medication Assisted Treatment (CB-MAT) & Enhanced MAT (E-MAT)



About CB-MAT:

- CB-MAT is offered in traditional licensed outpatient clinics or Federally Qualified Health Centers that typically offer an array of other behavioral health, recovery and primary care supports.
- The medications offered within state-funded CB-MAT programs are buprenorphine and naltrexone.
- Naloxone prescriptions or kits are available along with training on how to administer.
- Depending on the particular clinic, a multi-disciplinary team is available for clinical and recovery support that may include individual, group and family therapy; recovery coach services, employment support, psychiatric services, primary care and dental care.

About E-MAT:

- E-MAT provides the same services as CB-MAT, in addition to providing a full-time employment specialist to help with interview skills and resume writing.
