



Mobile Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) & Recovery Coaching

The MAT vehicles are staffed by a nurse or physician and a peer recovery support counselor. Individuals in withdrawal from opioids or otherwise ready to start treatment can visit the vehicle to receive a prescription for Suboxone to help with cravings and withdrawal symptoms. They will also have immediate access to the peer counselor, a Narcan overdose reversal kit and other harm reduction supplies, referral to a treatment center, and support obtaining the prescription from the pharmacy. No medication other than Narcan is carried in the vehicle or by staff. The service is free and does not require proof of insurance; however, individuals must be over 18 to utilize the service.
