

## Games for good: Reaching adolescents where they are for better health outcomes



## Guest Speaker: Lynn E. Fiellin, MD

Lynn E. Fiellin, M.D. is a Professor of Medicine at the Yale School of Medicine, at the Yale Child Study Center, and at the Yale School of Public Health. Her work focuses on developing and testing novel videogame interventions to promote health and reduce risk in youth and young adults. She has received funding from the National Institutes of Health including NICHD, NIDA, and NIAAA, the CVS Health Foundation, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the NIH/FDA, and the BEST Foundation/Conrad N. Hilton Foundation. . She and her team of researchers, game developers, and community partners have created and evaluated interactive evidence-based games addressing a number of health-related and medical issues in adolescents ranging from mental health, opioid misuse, smoking/vaping, and sexual health and HIV/STI prevention. Her digital health game interventions are designed and built with input from adolescents at every step of development.
