Block Grant updates

FFY26 Block Grant budget

- Budget yet to be passed, CR until end of FFY
- Significant cuts proposed in President's budget
- For now, assuming flat funding
- MHBG and SUBG Allocation Plan currently based on flat funding
- Updates will be made when budget is finalized

Total FFY25 award: \$9,794,675

- Adult Mental Health Services: \$6,067,889
- Children's Mental Health Services: \$3,726,786

Adult portion of award targeted to required areas (set-asides), priority populations, and priority services

- Submit allocation plans to legislature for review (August)
- Public hearing (usually September)
- Approval of allocation plans by legislature (September)
