


Money Follows the Person (MFP)

- 1140 Applications received, representing residents in 168 different skilled nursing facilities.
- 176 participants transitioned from 84 different nursing homes. The highest number of participants transitioned from any single nursing home was six (6).


Referrals by Target Waiver



176 MFP Enrollments by Waiver




Reasons Not Enrolled (276 of 1140)





- 35 Actively Planning


Accepted vs. Enrolled by County




Age Ranges for Enrolled Waiver Clients




Enrolled by Month

 - Reduce inappropriate admissions of DMHAS clients to nursing homes

AND

- Monitor short-term admissions that do occur for appropriate placement and/or eventual discharge back to their community with support services.
- New PASSR vendor: To assist in above goals, effective February 1, 2010

DMHAS Nursing Home Diversion Project July 2008 to Feb 2010

Nurses have been able to facilitate

- 131 transitions out of Nursing Facilities
- 180 diversions from Nursing Facilities
