

CORE MEASURES: Underage Drinking					
Measure	Current Data, Description and Source Description should include name and year of survey, age of participants, and method of administration and exact language of question.	Prior Data and Source			
Average age of onset of use. The average age that youth report first trying alcohol.					
Past 30-day use. The percent of youth who report using alcohol.					
Perception of risk or harm. The percent of youth who report that regular use of alcohol has moderate or great risk.					
Perception of parental disapproval of use. The percent of youth who report their parents feel that regular use of alcohol is wrong or very wrong.
