


About Norwich Prevention Council

Short-Term Outcomes

- We expanded coalition membership from a total of 20 members to 45 members representing 12 sectors.
- Increased the number of evidence-based practices to address Non-Medical Use of Prescription Drugs from baseline.

Educational Trainings



Norwich's middle school staff were trained in SBIRT and QPR. We have completed 3 cycles of a Substance Abuse prevention class for at-risk youth.

Long-Term Outcomes

• *Our goal is to reduce current rate of youth who report* having used a prescription drug not prescribed to them in the past 30 days to 3% by 2020.
