About Vernon ROCKS Coalition

The mission of Vernon ROCKS is to provide **R**esources & **O**utreach for **C**ommunity **K**nowledge & **S**uccess to prevent youth substance abuse. Vernon ROCKS is a collaboration of community stakeholders, parents, youth, and volunteers, whose focus is to prevent the use of drugs and alcohol in Vernon's youth by promoting protective factors and decreasing risk factors that contribute to substance use.

Funding sources include a Partnership For Success grant from the CT Department of Mental Health & Addiction Services (DMHAS), local prevention council funding, & mini-grants as available.
