Interview themes included: getting used to doing more with less; opportunities to create new partnerships with local organizations; health departments recognizing importance of epidemiologists and adding to their staff (which helps track other important trends as well - e.g. opioid epidemic); exploring opportunities to minimize silos and increase cross-collaboration within departments/divisions; flexibility in work schedules; use of EAPs.	

	Interventions include: Cultural Ideas from NACCHO Joy in Work Toolkit; Personalized Interventions within the EAP (including trainings/workshops); Positive Psychology (free online courses available) and Mindfulness-Based Stress Reduction (MBSR); Physical Activity; Diet; Flexible Work (hybrid work); Ergonomic work station improvement; Wellness lunch-and-learn; Mental Health Emergency Preparedness; Grant Opportunities to expand mental health and wellness (e.g. HRSA Health Workforce Grants).
