## Prevention Strategies were categorized by type, population, delivery setting and funding sources. Strengths, limitations and other considerations of this assessment were reviewed. Key Findings include: organizations are using a broad range of prevention strategies; there are efforts supporting the lifespan; many are implemented across community settings and online. Most towns receive LPC grant funding; urban towns are more likely to have multiple funding sources. Funding gaps were found in five towns. Information dissemination, education and social marketing are the most commonly implemented primary prevention strategies. Opportunities for expanding purview in the future to be inclusive of secondary prevention and expanding the definition of harm reduction?
