Naloxone	 RBHAOs in partnership with DCF Academy for Workforce Development (AWD) are in the process of implementing a statewide training. Anticipated completion of DCF Staff training by end of year. Ongoing training for new staff will be integrated with AWD. In the process of meeting with Foster Care Division to discuss recommendation of foster parents having Naloxone in their homes. Efforts continue training foster families about substance use and reducing stigma. Naloxone kits will be available in the DCF offices along with PPE gloves and face shields. Service resources will be displayed nearby.
