




Bills Reported Out of Committee

Did You Know?

After a bill has been voted out of committee, it can be referred to another committee. Oftentimes, this happens when a bill involves a topic that falls another committee of cognizance. For example, if a committee votes a bill out that may have a fiscal note to the floor, it can then be referred to the Appropriations Committee since it involves money.

The referred committee will then have 7 days to take action on that bill. This means they can either vote the bill out of committee and take no action at all and the bill will not move forward.
