LEGAL NOTICE

Effective May 1, 2025 pursuant to Section 26-192e of the Connecticut General Statutes, the Department of Agriculture Bureau of Aquaculture will change the shellfish classifications in New London waters. Offshore Restricted Relay waters in New London are being reclassified as Prohibited; all waters in the City are now classified as Prohibited.

RE: Reclassification of shellfish growing areas in New London, CT

Ms. Muggeo,

The Department of Agriculture Bureau of Aquaculture (DoAg) is required to reevaluate shellfish growing area classifications in the State on an annual basis, to accurately reflect the appropriate designated use of the area and remain in compliance with the requirements of the National Shellfish Sanitation Program (NSSP). The DoAg is required to complete comprehensive Sanitary Survey Reports for all Towns with active shellfish growing areas every 12 years, unless all waters are classified as Prohibited.

The following shellfish growing areas in New London are reclassified effective May 1, 2025:

• To reduce staff time burdens and due to the highly developed nature of New London, the remaining offshore Restricted Relay area will be reclassified as Prohibited. This change is administrative, as the DoAg intended to reclassify all New London waters as Prohibited in 2019, when the USFDA's 2017 Program Element Evaluation Report identified the classification of a portion of the Thames River as an emerging concern. The extensive military installations and industrial facilities prevented the Bureau from conducting shoreline surveys of large portions of the Thames River shoreline. In accordance with the National Shellfish Sanitation Program, "Each growing area which is not subjected to a sanitary survey every 12 years shall be classified as prohibited..."

Copies of the new classification descriptions for the shellfish growing areas in New London are being provided to the United States Food and Drug Administration, the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection, and the New London City Clerk.




