OPTIONS FOR TREATMENT

- Exposure to difficult situations, violence, hazardous materials, excessive noise, infectious disease.
- Working in confined spaces with Physical and Psychological demands.

PERSONAL TRAUMA

- Personal, family, relationship issues.
- Having your own safety jeopardized.
- Physical, sexual, psychological abuse.
- Military Combat exposure.
- Natural disasters.
- PTSD. Medical issues for self or family.
- Death of a loved one.

ADDICTIONS

- Prescription medications.
- Alcohol.
- Technology.
- Narcotics.
- Marijuana.
- Sex.
- Food.
- Steroids.
- Gambling.
- Shopping.
- Other street drugs.



DID YOU KNOW?

- **Approximately 1 and 5 adults in the U.S. experiences mental illness each year.**
- **Among the 20.2 million adults in the U.S. with substance abuse problems 50.5% had co-occurring mental illness.**
- **18.1% of adults in the U.S. live with an anxiety disorder such as PTSD or OCD.**
- **Combining medication with therapy there is a 75%-90% treatment of many anxiety disorders**
- **Some of the programs that EAU refers employees to have success rates 300% better than the national average**
