Temporary Surrenders from the Connecticut Department of Energy

and Environmental Protection (DEEP)

State Environmental Conservation Police have been authorized to utilize our Correctional Centers to house arrestees on temporary surrender status. The DEEP estimate of the number of offenders that may be housed in such a manner annually is ten. Most will be males.

Environmental Conservation Police Officers will arrive in grey Ford Expeditions or Green Ford F-250 pickup trucks, will be in uniform and will present proper identification. Officers will be required to present proper temporary surrender paperwork to our booking staff. Any offender that is intoxicated or in need of acute medical care shall not be accepted. Upon acceptance of a temporary surrender, a Shift Supervisor shall complete Attachment H, Temporary Surrender Checklist in accordance with Administrative Directive 9.3. It shall be the responsibility of the of the DEEP to transport the arrestee to the appropriate court on the next business day.

Temporary Surrenders from the Connecticut Department of Revenue Services

Special Agents from the Connecticut Department of Revenue Services (DRS) have been authorized to utilize our Correctional Centers to house arrestees on temporary surrender status. The number of offenders incarcerated will be small and will be transported to court via Judicial Marshall on the next business day.

Special Agents of the DRS will arrive in plain clothes and provide identification from the Special Investigation Section. They will arrive in one of the following vehicles: Ford Fusion, Ford Escape, Ford Explorer or Chevy Impala. Officers will be required to present proper temporary surrender paperwork to our booking staff.

Any offender who is intoxicated or in need of acute medical care shall not be accepted. Upon acceptance of a temporary surrender, a Shift Supervisor shall complete Attachment H, Temporary Surrender Checklist in accordance with Administrative Directive 9.3, *Inmate Admissions, Transfers and Discharges.*
