Re: ePay Rollout (Direct Deposit Only)

Last year the Office of the State Comptroller and Department of Administrative Services successfully piloted the rollout of ePay, which enables employees to view their pay records online in Core-CT. In 2013, ePay will be released in phases to all state agencies with the ultimate goal of transitioning state employees and retirees to a paperless payment system in order to save money, conserve paper and provide more efficient

service.

Employees who use Core-CT can already access their paycheck information on-line using their existing Core-CT User ID and password. With the expansion, access to ePay is now available to all current employees who never had a Core-CT User ID and to new hires as well.

Employee ID will be used for all 'new' User IDs in Core-CT and the temporary password will reflect the employee's first four (4) letters of Last Name (all in uppercase) + last four (4) digits of SSN. (Example password: 'SMIT1234') This temporary password will expire the first time it is used and the employee will be prompted to change it.

Core-CT User IDs are portable. If an employee transfers to another agency or leaves state service and is rehired, their Core-CT User ID will not change. Re-activation of User IDs and password resets may be required, as a result.

Paycheck information will be available online the morning of pay day, typically the Thursday of pay week. Two years of historical paycheck data will be available online. **During this rollout, employees will still receive a printed pay statement until we coordinate a date to stop printing direct deposit advices.** This move to 'paperless' has worked successfully for a number of agencies. We encourage you to use this ePay feature and welcome any feedback.
