DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING NOW ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS FOR OPERATING EXPENSE FUNDING

(Hartford, CT) -- Commissioner Seila Mosquera-Bruno of the Department of Housing announced today a Request for Applications (RFA) for Operating Expense Funding in the amount of over \$940,000 for qualified Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDO). The RFA can be found on the Department's website listed under programs. A pre-submittal conference will be held on a later date to aide interested organizations.

The CHDO Operating Expense is designed to provide operating funds to CHDOs based on financial need and the expectation that the organization is utilizing or will utilize the City's HOME CHDO setaside funding within 24 months of the award. Operating expenses must be reasonable and necessary costs that will further the CHDO's ability to develop, own, and/or sponsor an eligible housing development project.

"CHDOs are an important component of creating and preserving homes that are affordable. Providing this support helps these organizations remain financially viable and help sustain the necessary services that they provide. I look forward to our continuing collaboration with CHDOs around the state of Connecticut." said **Seila Mosquera-Bruno, Commissioner of Housing**.

"We commend the Department of Housing for finding creative ways to support community development organizations during this critical time.
