## NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING AND COMMUNITY INPUT PERIOD

The State of Connecticut Department of Housing is seeking public input on the Draft of the State of Connecticut 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development

The Department of Housing is seeking community input into the draft of the 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development. The Consolidated Plan (ConPlan) is a five-year strategic plan that governs the administration of federal funding appropriated for housing and community development activities that benefit persons of low- and moderate-income. Such federal funding includes the National Housing Trust Fund (NHTF), the HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), Small Cities/Community Development Block Grant (SC/CDBG), the Recovery Housing Program (RHP), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA). The 2025-2029 ConPlan represents approximately \$150 million in federal funding over the five-year period. A thirty-day public comment period will begin April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025 and end on May 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2025.

The Department of Housing will host a public hearing for members of the public on Wednesday, April 16<sup>th</sup>, 2025 at 5:30pm.
