

NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

The State of Connecticut Department of Housing
is seeking public input into the development of the State of Connecticut 2019-2020
Annual Action Plan for Housing and Community Development

The 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan for Housing and Community Development is the fifth annual implementation plan under the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development (ConPlan). The ConPlan is a five-year strategic plan that governs the administration of federal funding appropriated for housing and community development activities that benefit persons of low- and moderate- income. Such federal funding includes the new National Housing Trust Fund (NHTF), the HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), Small Cities/Community Development Block Grant (SC/CDBG), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA). The 2015-2019 ConPlan represents approximately \$145 million in federal funding over the five-year period.

A Public Meeting will be held, as listed below, to solicit input into the development of the 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan. All input received will be used in the development of the 2019-2020 Action Plan.
