Narratives

Disaster Damage:

Hurricane Sandy resulted in extraordinary destruction all along the Connecticut coastline, both as a result of high winds, storm surge in excess of 11 feet in some locations due to the astronomical high tide, as well as 6 to 10 foot waves on top of the surge. According to the United States Army Corp of Engineers, water levels at the Stamford Hurricane Barrier exceeded all recorded storms, which date back to 1893. Preliminary data indicates Hurricane Sandy resulted in flooding close to, or at, the one hundred year storm level from East Haven to Greenwich. A review of state records indicates that in a significant portion of the State's coastal area, Hurricane Sandy exceeded the 1938 Hurricane, becoming the most severe storm in Connecticut history.

Connecticut sustained severe coastal flooding and damaging winds. Along the coast, tropical storm force winds combined with high tides and a full moon, resulting in tidal stacking and significant wave heights. Entire neighborhoods became inundated with storm waters. Residents who did not heed evacuation orders were trapped in their homes and had to be evacuated. Local fire departments performed a total of 144 rescues, while the Connecticut National Guard supported 73 missions, including 6 life-saving rescue efforts.

There were six fatalities in Connecticut as a result of the storm, including an Easton Fire Lieutenant, killed by a falling tree at the height of the storm while performing response operations. Telecommunications across the State were crippled by the storm. Cellular transmission sites were disabled or damaged and communications and cable companies brought in hundreds of generators in order to address critical issues such as the loss of 911 dispatch networks. Flooding and power outages caused raw sewage discharges at treatment plants and pumping stations in seven cities, contaminating flood waters. Bridgeport officials said 15 to 20 million gallons of partially treated sewage from two plants were discharged into the Long Island Sound.

Many essential services were affected by this storm. Airports were either closed entirely or were reduced to limited service. The Metro North New Haven Line, Amtrak Intercity and Shore Line East commuter rails were all shut down. On October 31, when New York Harbor was closed to all shipping traffic, fuel barges could not supply fuel terminals in New Haven and Bridgeport. Fuel supply was also impeded as hundreds of gas stations were closed due to the power outages. The State's Department of Consumer Protection reported that at the peak of Hurricane Sandy's impact on the fuel distribution system, 866 out of 1,493 gas stations (i.e. over 50%) were without power and residents were unable to obtain gas, or waited in long lines at the few open stations. Residents not only from Connecticut but from heavily affected communities in bordering New York State, such as Port Chester, Rye and White Plains, came to Connecticut in search of fuel, placing a heavy demand on an already low fuel supply.

Recovery Needs:

Owner Occupied Housing (Rehabilitation and Mitigation) - Data from FEMA, SBA, DOI, and the surveys submitted to the State by municipalities and public housing authorities indicate that approximately 38,200 homes were damaged by Hurricane Sandy in the Fairfield, New Haven, Middlesex and New London Counties. The total value of losses exceeded \$288 million. After calculating insured losses, FEMA and SBA financial assistance and other benefits, the remaining unmet need is estimated to be between \$47 and \$57 million representing approximately 7,400 units. This range of estimated unmet housing needs anticipates that as the recovery process proceeds, additional unmet needs may present themselves, including, for example, damages not previously known or estimated, increased mitigation needs, and the consideration of code compliance.

Multifamily Housing (Rehabilitation, New Construction & Mitigation) - Approximately 1,298 multifamily LMI units were directly affected by Hurricane Sandy. Of these 1,298 units, 483 units are not in a flood plain and only require rehabilitation at an estimated aggregate cost of \$1.63 million (all of which is an unmet need). The remaining 815 units are in the flood plain and require either rehabilitation and mitigation or demolition and new construction at one or more other sites, at an estimated aggregate cost of \$240 million, and an unmet need of \$148 million. The unmet need estimate in this housing sector does not include construction of over 100 units of new affordable multifamily units that are needed in the CDBG-DR Program eligible areas. New affordable units, including net new units affordable to households at low and very low-income levels is critical to



minimize the impact of Hurricane Sandy on individuals and families that are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless and a key component to the long term recovery of the State.

Fair Housing - Affirmatively furthering fair housing and Equal Opportunity compliance will be achieved by a Fair Housing Action Plan that complies with DOH's guidelines/policies, including but not limited to:

- 1. Affirmatively furthering fair housing through established affirmative marketing policies.
- a. Affirmative marketing efforts for the CDBG-DR funding include the following: An Affirmative Marketing Plan, based on the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regulations that outline the policies and procedures for housing activities to affirmatively market units financed through the Multifamily and Owner Occupied (Rehabilitation/Reconstruction) Programs including dissemination of information, technical assistance to applicants, project management, reporting requirements, and project review.

 2.Ensuring that eligible persons from all racial, ethnic, national origin, religious, familial status, the disabled, "special needs," gender groups, and/or other populations least likely to apply, are:
- a. Fully informed of vacant units available for rent.
- b. Encouraged to apply for rehabilitation and/or rent.
- c. Given the opportunity to rent the unit of their choice.
- d. Given the opportunity to rehabilitate their primary residence, which sustained damages due to disasters and/or its after-efInfornilable opportu

als, publications, direct contact, workshops/seminars, and through the placement of flyers/posters in public facilities.

4.The prioritization of housing and economic development activities and other planning activities that affect racial, ethnic and low-income concentrations to promote the availability of affordable housing in low-poverty, non-minority areas.

Infrastructure and Public Facilities - In response to the State's request for information regarding unmet infrastructure needs, local governments identified at least thirty-four infrastructure projects with unmet needs totaling approximately \$21.4 million. There are a number of infrastructure projects that have the potential to affect the health, safety and welfare of the local community and are therefore urgent priorities. The allocation of \$4 million of the funding for infrastructure projects will focus on unmet needs that are urgent in nature and can be immediately addressed, including water and sewer repairs (\$1 million); municipal-owned utility repairs (\$1.1 million); and critical road repairs (\$1 million). The balance of the allocation (\$900,000) will be used to initiate architectural, environmental and other preconstruction activities for infrastructure projects to be undertaken with future allocations of funds. For public facilities, the State requested unmet needs data; local governments identified at least eighty-eight projects with unmet needs totaling approximately \$34.5 million. Based on a preliminary review of the public building repair projects identified by local governments, many are ready to be undertaken immediately at a total cost of approximately \$1.5 million. Additional funds (\$700,000) will be used to initiate architectural, engineering, environmental and other preconstruction activities for the public facility projects to be undertaken with future allocations of funds.

Economic Revitalization - In response to the State's request for unmet needs data, local governments identified at least twelve structural repair projects for businesses totaling \$5.3 million and an additional \$5 million of repair or replacement of equipment. In total, the unmet need for economic revitalization identified by local governments is currently estimated at \$10.3 million. A wide range of businesses were impacted with the greatest concentration of monetary damages in Other Amusement and Recreational Facilities (\$1.3 million); Hotels of various types (\$1 million) and Restaurants of various types (\$1 million). Many of the impacted businesses were either on or close to the shoreline, including a high percentage in the 100-year flood plain. A range of businesses were impacted, with the greatest concentration of costs in Plumbing, Heating, and Air-Conditioning Contractors (\$400,000); and Restaurants of various types (\$310,000).

Planning - The State recognizes that future storms may severely damage homes, businesses, infrastructure and public facilities in municipalities throughout Connecticut. It is essential that our infrastructure and public facilities be hardened in anticipation of these events. In addition, a significant and necessary investment has been made in preparation for the receipt and distribution of the Funding. Accordingly, the State will utilizeaportionofthesePlanningfundstooffsetthecosts incurred to

developtheproposedprogramsandactivitiesthroughwhichtheFundingwillbeadministered.

Overall Progress Narrative:

The State of Connecticut, Department of Housing (DOH) as the grantee of Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program allocated to the State of Connecticut by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the Superstorm Sandy recovery has prepared this quarterly report addressing the funding expenditures through the end of the second quarter of 2018.

This Quarterly Performance Report indicates that through June 30, 2018 the State of Connecticut expended more than \$3M in CDBG-DR funds with the largest amount of funds being expended in the Multifamily Housing activity. This quarter, the department made a number of changes to the Action Plan which includes but was not limited to the following: corrected flags; changed activity budgets to match department's internal accounting software project values and expenses; revised activity expenditures to ensure that expenses are properly coded to ensure compliance with 24 month disbursement deadline as required by HUD after the shift from cumulative back to 24 month disbursements.

The State of Connecticut has allocated CDBG-DR funds to seven (7) major program areas: Owner Occupied Housing, Multifamily Housing, Economic Revitalization, Infrastructure, Planning, Public Facilities and Rebuild by Design. Additional information on these programs are available in the activities section of this Quarterly Performance Report.

Owner Occupied Rehabilitation and Rebuilding Program

The State of Connecticut continues to implement a program that protects the homeowners, taxpayers and the State from fraud, waste, and abuse - we are not simply cutting checks. We are working to ensure that the work that is done to restore the property of our citizens is done properly, consistent with good quality work and materials, while ensuring that those homeowners who are displaced from their homes receive the priority assistance they need. There were a total of eight hundred and thirty-nine (839) applicants who indicated on their application that they were seeking recovery assistance under the Owner Occupied Housing Recovery programs. Many applicants stated needing more than one area of assistance on their applications. Applicants chose multiples of rehabilitation, reimbursement, and/or mitigation on their applications. All applications were reviewed and three hundred ninety-six (396) were deemed eligible for assistance and seven hundred forty-two (742) were deemed ineligible for assistance, or for some portion of the requested assistance, because they did not meet eligibility criteria (430 denied), they choose to withdraw (132), or were closed (180) due to non-response to DOH's inquiries. Applicants who had multiple program requests, for instance rehabilitation and reimbursement, were counted for each program they applied to for assistance.

As of the second quarter of 2018 there were a total of four hundred and twenty-two (422) applications specifically for the Owner Occupied Rehabilitation and Rebuilding program. One hundred and thirty-two (132) were deemed eligible and a total of two hundred ninety (290) applicants were deemed ineligible (denied 134, withdrawn 75, closed 81) for the CDBG-DR grants under the Owner Occupied Rehabilitation and Rebuilding program.

As on June 30, 2018 there were seventeen (17) projects under construction and one hundred ten (110) projects have been completed in the Owner Occupied Reabilition and Rebuilding program.

Owner Occupied Reimbursement Program

In accordance with the program guidelines, homeowners who have exceeded the maximum grant award



on the rehabilitation of their damaged homes will not be eligible for reimbursement grants under this program. As of the second quarter of 2018, we have made award determinations and issued contracts to two hundred five (205) applicants. Unfortunately, fifteen (15) homeowners decided to withdraw from the program after their contracts had been issued primarily due to the fact that they were required to maintain flood insurance for the life of the property. Additionally, six (6) applications were closed due to non-response, and one (1) was denied after contract issuance, leaving 183 eligible applicants for reimbursement.

As of June 30, 2018, all one hundred and eighty-three (183) eligible applicants have been reimbursed for their out of pocket expenses. To date we have had twelve (12) reimbursement applicants return their reimbursements due to selling their homes within the five-year compliance period, or because of duplication of benefits findings.

Owner Occupied Mitigation Program

As a result of Second Tranche of funding we are able to address mitigation applications. In accordance with the program guidelines, homeowners with properties located in the floodplain and with household incomes at or below 100% of the area median income (Priority Level A) are eligible to receive a maximum grant award of up to two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250,000) to assist in the elevation of their homes above the 500 year floodplain thus making these homes more resilient to withstand future storm damages.

Households with incomes at or above 101% of Area Median Income (AMI) may be eligible for a Mitigation Reimbursement. Mitigation Reimbursements are capped at a maximum dollar amount depending the AMI at time of closing. Upon completion of the mitigation measures and elevating their home above the base flood elevation homeowners could be reimbursed a portion of their out-of-pocket costs.

As of June 30, 2018 (6) mitigation projects were under construction, and twenty-three (23) projects have been completed. We have made Mitigation Reimbursement award determinations on seven (7) applicants, one (1) low to moderate income applicant, and six (6) Urgent Need applicants.

Multifamily Assistance Program

The State allocated a total of \$29,000,000 to assist in long-term recovery and restoration of multifamily housing units with a direct benefit to low to moderate income individuals, impacted as a result of Superstorm Sandy located in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven. In addition, it also provides assistance to 1-4 unit rental properties damaged by Superstorm Sandy that will be occupied by low to moderate income individuals upon completion. Three large multifamily projects were awarded funding and two of these project have been completed and one is currently under construction.

Infrastructure Program

The State allocated a total of \$35,000,000 to assist in the planning activities associated with improving the resiliency of infrastructure, public facilities, and providing mitigation activities. A total of 23 projects were deemed eligible for funding committing the entire allocation of funding. Thee poects include 6 water and drainage projects that will provide a direct benefit for urgent need residents in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven; 3 road repair and reconstruction projects that will provide a direct benefit for urgent need residents in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven; 1 non-residential infrastructure project in New London county; 8 nonresidential infrastructure projects located in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven; 3 road repair and reconstruction projects that will provide a direct benefit for low to moderately income residents in the most impacted Counties of Fairfield and New Haven and 2 water and drainage projects in New London County. The respective quarterly updates on each of these projects can be found in the respective activity project narratives.

The State of Connecticut allocated a total of \$9,029,000 to assist in the planning activities associated with improving the resiliency of infrastructure, public facilities, and providing mitigation activities. In the first tranche nine (9) projects were approved, committing the entire allocation of funding. All of these projects are in the final stages of the planning studies. In the second tranche twenty-four (24) projects were approved, committing the entire allocation of funding, contracts have been executed for all of these projects and the municipalities or agencies are in the preliminary stages of their planning activities. The thirty two (32) planning projects are listed below with their respective project updates.

• On April 27th, Building A (10 units) received its temporary certificate of occupancy. To date, landscaping has been completed and final site work along the back-parking lot is expected to wrap up early this week. A Final Certificate of Occupancy is expected by mid-July.

In Building B (70 units), Permanent power has been turned on andgas service was fully installed on 7/6. Ceiling grids have beeninstalled on all floors, and cabinet and appliance installationare ongoing on all floors. Additional



progress on Building B exterior includes, townhouse unit handrail installation last week, and the store front window installation is substantially complete. Of the total direct construction costs included in the construction contract, 18% has been awarded to MBE firms (project goal 12.5%), 38% to State Certified Small Businesses (project goal 25%), 3% to Section 3 firms (project goal 10%), and Dimeo continues to make progress toward achieving our goals. Of the total number of hours worked so far, 38% have been minority (project goal 25%), 2% have been women (project goal 6.9%), 5% have been Section 3 (no project goal specified), and 90% have been CT residents (no project goal specified).

To date 10 new hires have been made to work on construction related jobs on the site. Of those new hires 4 individuals qualifyas Section 3, representing 40% (project goal 30%), 3 of those individuals are also Washington Village residents. The Norwalk Housing Authority, their relocation consultant (HOU), and Trinity Management, have been working diligently on leasing efforts and nine of the 10 units in building A are occupied. The 10th unit is temporarily being utilized as the Leasing Office until the permanent space in Building B is ready. This same team has begun pre-leasing efforts for building B and have begun assigning returning resident to units.

Work on the City's public infrastructure project adjacent to our site is progressing well under the oversite of the City's Construction Manager, O&G, and the regrading of the public right of way is substantially complete. The remaining work includes, street light installation and final paving, expected to wrap up later this summer. Sidewalksand curbing along Building A is complete. Trinity and Dimeo meet monthly with the City's Department of Public Works and O&G to discuss the status of the public infrastructure project and work through coordination matters related to the Washington Village Phase One project. Work on the adjacent Ryan Park improvements continues to track on schedule, remediation is complete, and storm water drainage is being installed. The remaining work is expected to be complete by mid-July.

Location Description:

The proposed Washington Village/South Norwalk Redevelopment project is located in the South Norwalk neighborhood of Norwalk, Fairfield County. The housing component of the project will occur on three publicly-owned parcels of land: the existing Washington Village site (Raymond and Day Streets), and two nearby vacant City-owned sites (13 Day Street and 20 Day Street). The three parcels total approximately 6.55 acres and are located within or partially within the limits of the 100-year floodplain.

Activity Progress Narrative:

• On April 27th, Building A (10 units) received its temporary certificate of occupancy. To date, landscaping has been completed and final site work along the back-parking lot is expected to wrap up early this week. A Final Certificate of Occupancy is expected by mid-July.

In Building B (70 units), Permanent power has been turned on andgas service was fully installed on 7/6. Ceiling grids have beeninstalled on all floors, and cabinet and appliance installationare ongoing on all floors. Additional progress on Building B exterior includes, townhouse unit handrail installation last week, and the store front window installation is substantially complete. Of the total direct construction costs included in the construction contract, 18% has been awarded to MBE firms (project goal 12.5%), 38% to State Certified Small Businesses (project goal 25%), 3% to Section 3 firms (project goal 10%), and Dimeo continues to make progress toward achieving our goals. Of the total number of hours worked so far, 38% have been minority (project goal 25%), 2% have been women (project goal 6.9%), 5% have been Section 3 (no project goal specified), and 90% have been CT residents (no project goal specified).

To date 10 new hires have been made to work on construction related jobs on the site. Of those new hires 4 individuals qualifyas Section 3, representing 40% (project goal 30%), 3 of those individuals are also Washington Village residents. The Norwalk Housing Authority, their relocation consultant (HOU), and Trinity Management, have been working diligently on leasing efforts and nine of the 10 units in building A are occupied. The 10th unit is temporarily being utilized as the Leasing Office until the permanent space in Building B is ready. This same team has begun pre-leasing efforts for building B and have begun assigning returning resident to units.

Work on the City's public infrastructure project adjacent to our site is progressing well under the oversite of the City's Construction Manager, O&G, and the regrading of the public right of way is substantially complete. The remaining work includes, street light installation and final paving, expected to wrap up later this summer. Sidewalksand curbing along Building A is complete. Trinity and Dimeo meet monthly with the City's Department of Public Works and O&G to discuss the status of the public infrastructure project and work through coordination matters related to the Washington Village Phase One project. Work on the adjacent Ryan Park improvements continues to track on schedule, remediation is complete, and storm water drainage is being installed. The remaining work is expected to be complete by mid-July.

It centers on a school of thought called "Housing First," the idea that people are much more likely to find success when they are no longer in a stressful crisis situation; rather than wait for people who have become homeless to be "housing ready," shelters help them into housing first, and then connect them with any additional services they might need. This intervention has low barriers to entry, high placement rates, and low rates of return to shelter.

Rapid re-housing acts as a trampoline, using targeted financial assistance and short-term services to quickly return individuals and families who have slipped into homelessness back into housing and stability. For shelters, using rapid re-housing to "exit" families and individuals into stable housing situations frees up shelter beds, reduces shelter overcrowding, and frees staff time to provide more intensive services for those with greater needs.

For the purpose of this activity the scope of work includes Construction / Reconstruction / Resiliency of other non-residential structures including but not limited to microgrids, generators, seawalls and revetments located in communities most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven.

Location Description:

Infrastructure projects including but not limitied to microgrids, generators, seawalls and revetments located in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The State of Connecticut has awarded funding to six (6) non-residential infrastructure projects that will provide a direct benefit for urgent need residents located in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven. Below is an update on these eight projects:

- 1. Milford Morningside Revetment Reconstruction \$1,180,480. RACE Coastal has submitted the design reviewed by the Flood Erosion Control Board and the City. The City and RACE Coastal met with Josh Helms from USACE on April 24, 2018 at the project location. USACE requested documentation from the City to verify that the adjacent seawall and revetment was indeed an Army Corp. project from the 1950s 1960s. The City researched existing records to provide information to USACE. Applications to USACE and to CT DEEP were submitted by RACE Coastal on 6/14/2018. Notices and letters were mailed to 50 adjacent residents in the project area. The City received two requests for additional information from the condominiums at 200-212 Point Beach Drive and from a neighbor close to the project address
- 2. New Haven East Shore Erosion Control \$1,900,000. Much progress has been made on the design of the beach nourishment option. Site investigations and Alternatives Analysis and Concept Evaluation phases have been completed and Phase 3 (Preliminary Design) is halfway complete. The Consultant submitted a report following Alternatives Analysis and Concept Evaluation phase which summarizes the analysis of the beach nourishment alternative.
- A community meeting was held after the submittal of the Alternatives Analysis and Concept Evaluation report to review the results of the report. About a dozen people attended the meeting. Participants were briefed on the findings in the report, the implications to the property behind their home, and the remaining tasks to be completed before construction.
- 3. Fairfield Penfield Beach Resiliency Improvements Bulkhead \$225,000. The Town is currently underway with a design that would be acceptable to CT DEEP and the Town's Flood and Erosion Control Board. During the 2nd quarter of 2018 the Town along with their engineering consultant have agreed on a resiliency plan that they will present to CT DEEP. If CT DEEP approves of their conceptual resiliency plan proper applications will be submitted CT DEEP and Fairfield's Planning and Zoning. 4. Milford Essential Generators \$195,000. The project is complete.
- 5. Stamford Generator Upgrades \$553,795 The City's purchase of a new generator was initiated in March 2018. In order to sustain the critical mission of the 911 Command Center, it is also necessary to provide an independent equipment cooling that can be fully supported by an emergency generator. This newly installed system would ensure the proper functioning of an EOC fully staffed with personnel and computer equipment. DOH approved an extension of time and supplemental CDBG-DR funding of \$250,000 to be matched with \$83,333 in local funds. An amended contract should be executed during the 3rd quarter of 2018.
- 6. Stratford Bunnell High School Generator \$310,000. The project is complete.

Location Description:

Infrasturcture roadway repair projects that will benefit Low to Moderate Income residents in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven Counties.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The State of Connecticut has awarded funding to three (3) road repair and reconstruction projects that will provide a direct benefit for low to moderately income residents in Fairfield County. Below is an update on these three projects:

1. Bridgeport – Crescent Crossing for Housing Development - \$3,277,992 The CDBG-DR portion of the infrastructure project was completed in the fourth quarter of 2016.



2. Bridgeport -Yellow Bridge Resiliency \$2,625,000. The project has reached completion and many key updates have been made, including a variety of storm hardening measures. The bascule pit walls have been elevated to prevent high sea levels from flooding compartments of the bridge. Removable bulkheads have been added to areas where water infiltration once was problematic. Automated pumping systems have been supplemented in order to dewater these sensitive locations in the event storm surge levels unexpectedly rise. During the course of the project, it was discovered that the Northeast leaf (span) was counterweight heavy, a condition causing unneeded strain on mechanical and electrical components. After strain gauging the bridge, a balance procedure was established and large steel blocks were removed from the back end of the leaf. Such preventative maintenance will prolong the life of the bridges internal mechanisms. The bridge not only operates more fluid but is now in a better position to withstand the damaging effects of major storm events. The project to date is 100% complete and is expected to be closed in the next couple weeks.

Like any major rehab, it is difficult to know what truly lies ahead. This is especially true when upgrading major electrical and mechanical components. During construction of such components, the plan changed when the bridges Northeast leaf machine brake was acting faulty. In order to properly dial in the closing set points / stop points, it was imperative that the brakes worked correctly. In order to properly adjust the electrical stop points during bridge closings, the bridges braking system needed to be addressed first. The traveling public requires a reliable movable bridge. Too often commuters are subject to unforeseen conditions – bridge stuck in the air because it doesn't function properly. Moments like these dictate and influence necessary change!

Bridge No. 03637 is in close proximity to a major interstate (I-95) and adjacent to Bridgeport's Steelpointe harbor Development. It was imperative that such measures were taken to rehabilitate this portion of a major thoroughfare. DOH should know that the funds attained will continue to positively impact the community and future development of the area.

3. Norwalk- Elevating Raymond and Day Streets- \$4,000,000 The City of Norwalk has signed contracts with: O&G-Construction Manager, K&W Construction- Site Contractor and several of the utility companies. The City has expanded its scope of work with Tighe & Bond Engineers to include some construction administration. Construction began in October 2017 and the sub-grade of the roads are at the finished height. Several catch basin resets and offsets have been completed. Granite curbs, concrete sidewalks and brick pavers have been installed throughout Day Street. The project at Ryan Park has made progress, but is not yet completed. The projected final completion date is still expected to be October 1, 2018.

Activity Description:

The Pequot Avenue Drainage Improvement Project will address flooding in the area between Maple Avenue and Converse Place where residential and commercial areas are routinely flooded via freshwater discharge from the railroad to the west and storm surge from the east. Inadequate storm drainage west of Pequot Avenue contributes to flooding of the roadway (which hinders north/south access). North of Greens Harbor Beach, a second outfall also contributes to flooding in Pequot Avenue. The outfall within the swimming area creates a safety problem. The requested funds will be used to make drainage improvements in Pequot Avenue and at both outfalls, including extending the outfall piping at Greens Harbor Beach away from the swimming area. Design plans have been developed compliance with state and local wetland protection procedures.

Location Description:

These funds will be used to support a project known as Pequot Avenue Drainage Improvements located in the area between Maple Avenue and Converse Place in New London. The proposed project will address flooding along the shore of Greens Harbor (Thames River) in the area where residential and commercial areas are routinely flooded via freshwater discharge from the railroad to the west and storm surge from the east.

The Greens Harbor project that was funded is located in Census Tract 6907 which has greater than 51% low-moderate income.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The State of Connecticut has awarded funding to one (1) water Sewer and drainage infrastructure project that will



provide a direct benefit for low to moderate income residents in New London County. Below is an update on this project:

- 1. New London Drainage Improvements –\$1,480,875. The City of New London contracted Milone & MacBroom, to complete a subsurface investigation and drainage design, and provide construction documents for the project. In the period from April 1 through June 30, 2018, Milone and MacBroom performed the following project action items:
- 1.Finalized and submitted the Structures, Dredging & Fill (SDF) Permit Application to the CTDEEP; 2.Responded to comments from the Army Corps of Engineers relative the SDF Application; 3.Performed final coordination with Utility Companies potentially affected by the project, in particular, Eversource Gas and the New London Public Utilities Commission 4.Developed temporary support details and specifications for buried utilities; 5.Developed road closure and detour plans (M&PT); 6.Performed in-house constructability review; and 7.Finalized plans, special provisions, and opinion of construction cost estimate.

Due to complications related to the work required to develop hydrologic and hydraulic computations, the construction phase is delayed by approximately nine months. Field reconnaissance (test pits) were found to contain free draining saturated material, which necessitated consultation with specialty consultants relative to dewatering and marine construction.

Public Outreach: 1.The City of New London has a webpage to update the public on significant Public Works projects throughout the City, which includes CDBG-DR projects. The website can be accessed at: https://nlpublicworksprojects.com/2. A semi-annual report on all City grant projects is provided by the Grants Manager to the City Council during a public meeting. 3. The Public Works Director meets monthly with the Public Works Committee, which is a councilmanic body of the City Council. Project updates are discussed with the Committee in a public forum.

Activity Description:

The State's Housing Recovery programs was established to meet the unmet housing needs of communities most impacted by Superstorm Sandy including the costs of repairs, reconstruction and new construction that insurance, FEMA and any other sources of funding does not cover. The general objectives of the State's housing programs include assisting people by replacing and rehabilitating homes, including identifying opportunities for mitigation enhancement measures and improving the resilience of their homes while restoring their buildings/residences.

Location Description:

The proposed Washington Village/South Norwalk Redevelopment project is located in the South Norwalk neighborhood of Norwalk, Fairfield County. The housing component of the project will occur on three publicly-owned parcels of land: the existing Washington Village site (Raymond and Day Streets), and two nearby vacant City-owned sites (13 Day Street and 20 Day Street). The three parcels total approximately 6.55 acres and are located within or partially within the limits of the 100-year floodplain.

Activity Progress Narrative:

• On April 27th, Building A (10 units) received its temporary certificate of occupancy. To date, landscaping has been completed and final site work along the back-parking lot is expected to wrap up early this week. A Final Certificate of Occupancy is expected by mid-July.

In Building B (70 units), Permanent power has been turned on and gas service was fully installed on 7/6. Ceiling grids have been installed on all floors, and cabinet and appliance installation are ongoing on all floors. Additional



progress on Building B exterior includes, townhouse unit handrail installation last week, and the store front window installation is substantially complete. Of the total direct construction costs included in the construction contract, 18% has been awarded to MBE firms (project goal 12.5%), 38% to State Certified Small Businesses (project goal 25%), 3% to Section 3 firms (project goal 10%), and Dimeo continues to make progress toward achieving our goals. Of the total number of hours worked so far, 38% have been minority (project goal 25%), 2% have been women (project goal 6.9%), 5% have been Section 3 (no project goal specified), and 90% have been CT residents (no project goal specified).

To date 10 new hires have been made to work on construction related jobs on the site. Of those new hires 4 individuals qualify as Section 3, representing 40% (project goal 30%), 3 of those individuals are also Washington Village residents. The Norwalk Housing Authority, their relocation consultant (HOU), and Trinity Management, have been working diligently on leasing efforts and nine of the 10 units in building A are occupied. The 10th unit is temporarily being utilized as the Leasing Office until the permanent space in Building B is ready. This same team has begun pre-leasing efforts for building B and have begun assigning returning resident to units.

Work on the City's public infrastructure project adjacent to our site is progressing well under the oversite of the City's Construction Manager, O&G, and the regrading of the public right of way is substantially complete. The remaining work includes, street light installation and final paving, expected to wrap up later this summer. Sidewalks and curbing along Building A is complete. Trinity and Dimeo meet monthly with the City's Department of Public Works and O&G to discuss the status of the public infrastructure project and work through coordination matters related to the Washington Village Phase One project. Work on the adjacent Ryan Park improvements continues to track on schedule, remediation is complete, and storm water drainage is being installed. The remaining work is expected to be complete by mid-July.

The infrastructure program is designed to address the unmet need of municipalities impacted by Superstorm Sandy. Infrastructure unmet needs are limited to the repair or replacement of existing infrastructure. The largest unmet need identified to date in the area of infrastructure is the repair or replacement of drainage systems. However, roads and seawalls also have significant unmet repair and rebuilding needs. These three areas constitute over seventy-six percent (76.26%) of repair and replacement activities identified. In total, nearly 99% of the activities identified as having unmet needs are located in Fairfield and New Haven counties. For the purpose of this activity the scope of work includes Construction / Reconstruction / Resiliency of other non-residential structures including but not limited to microgrids, generators, seawalls and revetments located in communities most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven.

Location Description:

Infrastructure projects including but not limitied to microgrids, generators, seawalls and revetments located in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The State of Connecticut has awarded funding to six (6) non-residential infrastructure projects that will provide a direct benefit for urgent need residents located in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven. Below is an update on these eight projects:

- 1. Milford Morningside Revetment Reconstruction \$1,180,480. RACE Coastal has submitted the design reviewed by the Flood Erosion Control Board and the City. The City and RACE Coastal met with Josh Helms from USACE on April 24, 2018 at the project location. USACE requested documentation from the City to verify that the adjacent seawall and revetment was indeed an Army Corp. project from the 1950s 1960s. The City researched existing records to provide information to USACE. Applications to USACE and to CT DEEP were submitted by RACE Coastal on 6/14/2018. Notices and letters were mailed to 50 adjacent residents in the project area. The City received two requests for additional information from the condominiums at 200-212 Point Beach Drive and from a neighbor close to the project address
- 2. New Haven East Shore Erosion Control \$1,900,000. Much progress has been made on the design of the beach nourishment option. Site investigations and Alternatives Analysis and Concept Evaluation phases have been completed and Phase 3 (Preliminary Design) is halfway complete. The Consultant submitted a report following Alternatives Analysis and Concept Evaluation phase which summarizes the analysis of the beach nourishment alternative.

A community meeting was held after the submittal of the Alternatives Analysis and Concept Evaluation report to review the results of the report. About a dozen people attended the meeting. Participants were briefed on the findings in the report, the implications to the property behind their home, and the remaining tasks to be completed



before construction.

- 3. Fairfield Penfield Beach Resiliency Improvements Bulkhead \$225,000. The Town is currently underway with a design that would be acceptable to CT DEEP and the Town's Flood and Erosion Control Board. During the 2nd quarter of 2018 the Town along with their engineering consultant have agreed on a resiliency plan that they will present to CT DEEP. If CT DEEP approves of their conceptual resiliency plan proper applications will be submitted CT DEEP and Fairfield's Planning and Zoning. 4. Milford Essential Generators \$195,000. The project is complete.
- 5. Stamford Generator Upgrades \$553,795 The City's purchase of a new generator was initiated in March 2018. In order to sustain the critical mission of the 911 Command Center, it is also necessary to provide an independent equipment cooling that can be fully supported by an emergency generator. This newly installed system would ensure the proper functioning of an EOC fully staffed with personnel and computer equipment. DOH approved an extension of time and supplemental CDBG-DR funding of \$250,000 to be matched with \$83,333 in local funds. An amended contract should be executed during the 3rd quarter of 2018.
- 6. Stratford Bunnell High School Generator \$310,000. The project is complete.

Location Description:

Infrasturcture roadway repair projects that will benefit Low to Moderate Income residents in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven Counties.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The State of Connecticut has awarded funding to three (3) road repair and reconstruction projects that will provide a direct benefit for low to moderately income residents in Fairfield County. Below is an update on these three projects:



- 1. Bridgeport Crescent Crossing for Housing Development \$3,277,992 The CDBG-DR portion of the infrastructure project was completed in the fourth quarter of 2016.
- 2. Bridgeport -Yellow Bridge Resiliency \$2,625,000. The project has reached completion and many key updates have been made, including a variety of storm hardening measures. The bascule pit walls have been elevated to prevent high sea levels from flooding compartments of the bridge. Removable bulkheads have been added to areas where water infiltration once was problematic. Automated pumping systems have been supplemented in order to dewater these sensitive locations in the event storm surge levels unexpectedly rise. During the course of the project, it was discovered that the Northeast leaf (span) was counterweight heavy, a condition causing unneeded strain on mechanical and electrical components. After strain gauging the bridge, a balance procedure was established and large steel blocks were removed from the back end of the leaf. Such preventative maintenance will prolong the life of the bridges internal mechanisms. The bridge not only operates more fluid but is now in a better position to withstand the damaging effects of major storm events. The project to date is 100% complete and is expected to be closed in the next couple weeks.

Like any major rehab, it is difficult to know what truly lies ahead. This is especially true when upgrading major electrical and mechanical components. During construction of such components, the plan changed when the bridges Northeast leaf machine brake was acting faulty. In order to properly dial in the closing set points / stop points, it was imperative that the brakes worked correctly. In order to properly adjust the electrical stop points during bridge closings, the bridges braking system needed to be addressed first. The traveling public requires a reliable movable bridge. Too often commuters are subject to unforeseen conditions – bridge stuck in the air because it doesn't function properly. Moments like these dictate and influence necessary change!

Bridge No. 03637 is in close proximity to a major interstate (I-95) and adjacent to Bridgeport's Steelpointe harbor Development. It was imperative that such measures were taken to rehabilitate this portion of a major thoroughfare. DOH should know that the funds attained will continue to positively impact the community and future development of the area.

3. Norwalk- Elevating Raymond and Day Streets- \$4,000,000 The City of Norwalk has signed contracts with: O&G-Construction Manager, K&W Construction- Site Contractor and several of the utility companies. The City has expanded its scope of work with Tighe & Bond Engineers to include some construction administration. Construction began in October 2017 and the sub-grade of the roads are at the finished height. Several catch basin resets and offsets have been completed. Granite curbs, concrete sidewalks and brick pavers have been installed throughout Day Street. The project at Ryan Park has made progress, but is not yet completed. The projected final completion date is still expected to be October 1, 2018.

Activity Description:

The State of Connecticut has awarded funding to two (2) water and drainage projects that will provide a direct benefit for low to moderate income residents in New Haven County. Below is a description of these two projects:

- 1. New Haven Union Avenue Mitigation and Resiliency \$4,000,000. These funds will be used for the Mitigation and Resiliency Projects for Union Avenue, in the City of New Haven: \$1,500,000 for planning for Phase One: Design Cost for Hill-to-Downtown/Union Avenue and \$2,500,000 for the project known as the Downtown Green Infrastructure Project. The project location is in the Downtown Drainage area, roughly delineated as Grove Street on the north, Dwight and Howard Avenues on the west, State Street and Church Street on the east, and Columbus Avenue and Union Avenue on the south. The project proposes to install green infrastructure within the 550 acre downtown drainage area to mitigate the impacts of storm water runoff on the City's storm sewer systems.
- 2. West Haven Old Field Creek Dredging \$525,000. The Old Field Creek Dredging Project will address flooding in and around Old Field Creek in the area between Beach Street, Blohm Street to Marshall Street, mainly residential areas, which are routinely flooded. Ineffective storm drainage from the creek contributes to flooding of the roadways in and around the residential properties in this area. The Old Field Creek dredging will greatly improve the water flow, whether it is the result of a storm surge from Long Island Sound or excessive rainfall.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The State of Connecticut has awarded funding to two (2) water and drainage projects that will provide a direct benefit for low to moderate income residents in New Haven County. Below is an update on these two projects:

- 1. New Haven Union Avenue Mitigation and Resiliency \$4,000,000. For the planning portion of the project: The RFP was advertised for this portion of the project and only one consultant team submitted a proposal. The proposal was prepared by CDM Smith which is the consultant that carried out the Downtown Stormwater Modeling project. Their experience with the SWMM model and alternative analysis will be valuable in saving time as we move forward with this portion of the design. After negotiations on scope and budget, the contract process is now underway.
- Urban Resources Initiative is required to outreach to properties that are adjacent to a potential bioswale installation at least one week prior to construction. We believe this kind of outreach prepares people for the minor disturbance during construction and ensures post-construction acceptance of the project. So far people have been very receptive to the installations.
- A green infrastructure bike ride was offered as part of the Arts and Ideas festival in New Haven. The project engineer attended and shared knowledge on green infrastructure and the downtown bioswale project. In addition to the intentional outreach, many informal conversations take place during construction as people are curious about the installations.
- 2. West Haven Old Field Creek Dredging \$525,000. The Old Field Creek Dredging project permit application was submitted to the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP). The City also provided DEEP with additional information requested and is awaiting DEEP's response so the project can move forward.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The State of Connecticut has awarded funding to seven (7) water and drainage projects that will provide a direct benefit for urgent need residents in the most impacted counties of Fairfield and New Haven.

- 1. Fairfield Waste Water Treatment Plant Resiliency \$2,316,000. The Town received the Dam Safety Permit and Water Quality Certification from CT DEEP during the 2nd quarter of 2018. The biddable Plans and Specifications have been completed and the project will go out to bid during the 3rd quarter of 2018. The bid will be awarded by the back half of the 3rd quarter and work will commence before the end of the 4th quarter.
- 2. Fairfield- Pine Creek Culvert Upgrade, \$560,000. This project is complete and construction has gone smoothly.
- 3. Fairfield- WPCF Outfall Pipe Repair, Grant \$74,500. The design drawings are complete. The project was put out to bid with only 1 response and it was over the engineers estimate. The project is currently undergoing value



engineering, afterwards the Town will put together revised bid documents and put the project back out to bid in the 3rd quarter of 2018

- 4. Fairfield Water Pollution Control Micro-Grid \$2,500,000. Trenching installation has been completed and conduits needed to connect the separate utilities are in process. The project has encountered many unforeseen conditions and the Town and contractor are reviewing a number of change orders. It is likely that the Town of Fairfield will request additional funds from the funding sources.
- 5. Milford- Calf Pen Area Flooding Study, \$638,250. Existing changes in site conditions required the site survey to be updated to reflect new construction. The I.T.B. # 1682 was published 6/14/18. 15 contractors attended a mandatory site walk on 6/19/2018. The City issued one addendum and received two bids on 7/11/2017. The bid results are being reviewed and a contractor will be selected by 7/20/18. We expect a project to be completed by end of November, 2018.
- 6. Milford- Bayview Beach Avenue Flooding Study & Drainage Improvements, \$1,726,150. The City of Milford completed street flooding surveys during January and February 2018 to document the extent of street flooding during Nor'easter and lunar tides. Based on these updated studies, the ideal location for underground and above ground pumping and drainage infrastructures was changed to Westland Avenue beach. Additional street intersection survey work has been completed and that is needed for the design specifications. The beach parcel of land that is owned by Deerfield Avenue Improvement Association does have a buried retaining wall that needs to be evaluated as part of the dune design. The City continues to talk to area residents to discuss the project status.
- 7. Milford- Milford Point Road Flooding Study & Drainage Improvements, \$301,537. Milone and MacBroom (MMI) is working to resolve a USACE permit requirement for Essential Fish Habitat and address full depth road construction specifications that the City requested. We have provided a project template to follow for developing the project manual needed for the Invitation to Bid (ITB) as we developed for the Beachland Avenue project. The City partnered with the local Milford Land Conservation Trust who owns adjacent property, to present the findings of the Archaeology Survey completed by AHS. Daniel Zoto, the archaeologist project manager presented to about 50 people at the Milford Library on June 20, 2018. We had thought we had the USACE permit finalized but confirmed there was additional requirements that MMI is working to complete. We are hopeful this project will be out to bid by August or September 2018. It may require an extension depending on the USACE permit.

The State of Connecticut has awarded funding to three (3) road repair and reconstruction projects that will provide a direct benefit for urgent need residents in New Haven County. Below is an update on these three projects:

1. West Haven – Beach Street & First Avenue Reconstruction –\$2,850,000. The City of West Haven is prepared to begin the construction process once Department of Energy and Environmental Protection and U.S. Army Corp of Engineers complete their permitting approvals. We anticipate this will occur in the near future so that construction can begin during the third quarter. Permit application for CT DEEP Flood Management Certification and Coastal Structures, Dredging, and Fill were filed with DEEP in early August 2017. Required legal notices and surrounding property owner notices have been completed. Coordination with DEEP National Diversity Database and the State Historic Preservation Office has also



been performed. A public information meeting was held in May 2017 to review the proposed project limits and solicit comments and input from interested parties.

- 2. East Haven Hemingway & Coe Avenue Reconstruction \$1,214,831. The Town of East Haven has contracted Haks Engineering for the project. Haks has completed topographical and utility surveys for the project area and has submitted plans to the State and set a coordination meeting with all the utilities to streamline communication and construction. The Town is approximately 45% through the process; is satisfied with the progress of the consultant; and expects that the project will continue on schedule to completion.
- 3. Norwalk Route 136 Bridge Resiliency \$2,625,000. The rehabilitation of Bridge 02295 over the Norwalk River is about 99% complete. It comprised the prevention of flooding from the river into the bridge compartments by installing coping walls at both the East & West Sides of the bridge. In addition the installation of removable structural steel plates at the bulkhead is also a measure to protect from flooding the generator at the lower level of the bridge control room. The bridge can now withstand and effectively handle the flooding from the river that used to be problematic prior to the bridge rehabilitation. The electrical systems were also upgraded and protected from moisture infiltrations. The navigation lights were upgraded to promote visibility. The relocation of the existing ladder and walk platform impacted by the place of the OWS at the bascule pit of the control room is now being added.

These costs are for the same project with funding being distributed in two obligations.

Activity Description:

The Pequot Avenue Drainage Improvement Project will address flooding in the area between Maple Avenue and Converse Place where residential and commercial areas are routinely flooded via freshwater discharge from the railroad to the west and storm surge from the east. Inadequate storm drainage west of Pequot Avenue contributes to flooding of the roadway (which hinders north/south access). North of Greens Harbor Beach, a second outfall also contributes to flooding in Pequot Avenue. The outfall within the swimming area creates a safety problem. The requested funds will be used to make drainage improvements in Pequot Avenue and at both outfalls, including extending the outfall piping at Greens Harbor Beach away from the swimming area. Location Description:

These funds will be used to support a project known as Pequot Avenue Drainage Improvements located in the area between Maple Avenue and Converse Place in New London. The proposed project will address flooding along the shore of Greens Harbor (Thames River) in the area where residential and commercial areas are routinely flooded via freshwater discharge from the railroad to the west and storm surge from the east.

The Greens Harbor project is located in Census Tract 6907 which has greater than 51% low-moderate income.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The State of Connecticut has awarded funding to one (1) water Sewer and drainage infrastructure project that will provide a direct benefit for low to moderate income residents in New London County. Below is an update on this project:

- 1. New London Drainage Improvements –\$1,480,875. The City of New London contracted Milone & MacBroom, to complete a subsurface investigation and drainage design, and provide construction documents for the project. In the period from April 1 through June 30, 2018, Milone and MacBroom performed the following project action items:
- 1.Finalized and submitted the Structures, Dredging & Fill (SDF) Permit Application to the CTDEEP; 2.Responded to comments from the Army Corps of Engineers relative the SDF Application; 3.Performed final coordination with Utility Companies potentially affected by the project, in particular, Eversource Gas and the New London Public Utilities Commission 4.Developed temporary support details and specifications for buried utilities; 5.Developed road closure and detour plans (M&PT); 6.Performed in-house constructability review; and 7.Finalized plans, special provisions, and opinion of construction cost estimate.

Due to complications related to the work required to develop hydrologic and hydraulic computations, the construction phase is delayed by approximately nine months. Field reconnaissance (test pits) were found to contain free draining saturated material, which necessitated consultation with specialty consultants relative to dewatering and marine construction.

Activity Description:

Location Description:

The proposed Washington Village/South Norwalk Redevelopment project is located in the South Norwalk neighborhood of Norwalk, Fairfield County. The housing component of the project will occur on three publicly-owned parcels of land: the existing Washington Village site (Raymond and Day Streets), and two nearby vacant City-owned sites (13 Day Street and 20 Day Street). The three parcels total approximately 6.55 acres and are located within or partially within the limits of the 100-year floodplain.

Activity Progress Narrative:



• On April 27th, Building A (10 units) received its temporary certificate of occupancy. To date, landscaping has been completed and final site work along the back-parking lot is expected to wrap up early this week. A Final Certificate of Occupancy is expected by mid-July.

In Building B (70 units), Permanent power has been turned on andgas service was fully installed on 7/6. Ceiling grids have beeninstalled on all floors, and cabinet and appliance installationare ongoing on all floors. Additional progress on Building B exterior includes, townhouse unit handrail installation last week, and the store front window installation is substantially complete. Of the total direct construction costs included in the construction contract, 18% has been awarded to MBE firms (project goal 12.5%), 38% to State Certified Small Businesses (project goal 25%), 3% to Section 3 firms (project goal 10%), and Dimeo continues to make progress toward achieving our goals. Of the total number of hours worked so far, 38% have been minority (project goal 25%), 2% have been women (project goal 6.9%), 5% have been Section 3 (no project goal specified), and 90% have been CT residents (no project goal specified).

To date 10 new hires have been made to work on construction related jobs on the site. Of those new hires 4 individuals qualifyas Section 3, representing 40% (project goal 30%), 3 of those individuals are also Washington Village residents. The Norwalk Housing Authority, their relocation consultant (HOU), and Trinity Management, have been working diligently on leasing efforts and nine of the 10 units in building A are occupied. The 10th unit is temporarily being utilized as the Leasing Office until the permanent space in Building B is ready. This same team has begun pre-leasing efforts for building B and have begun assigning returning resident to units.

Work on the City's public infrastructure project adjacent to our site is progressing well under the oversite of the City's Construction Manager, O&G, and the regrading of the public right of way is substantially complete. The remaining work includes, street light installation and final paving, expected to wrap up later this summer. Sidewalksand curbing along Building A is complete. Trinity and Dimeo meet monthly with the City's Department of Public Works and O&G to discuss the status of the public infrastructure project and work through coordination matters related to the Washington Village Phase One project. Work on the adjacent Ryan Park improvements continues to track on schedule, remediation is complete, and storm water drainage is being installed. The remaining work is expected to be complete by mid-July.

Of the seventeen, twelve units (12) have been completed and are now occupied providing twenty (20) housing units for low-moderate income households.

Three (3) are under construction. Two (2) projects are expected to be completed in the third quarter and the third (3) in the fourth quarter providing a total of five (5) new low/moderate income units.

When all sixteen (16) projects are completed, twenty-six (26) additional units of housing for low-moderate income households will have been created.

Activity Description:

This activity will complete the environmental review, final design, permitting, and construction for the pilot project for Resilient Bridgeport. That project will be built to reduce flood risk in the vicinity of the most vulnerable public housing in Bridgeport's South End / Black Rock Harbor area, Marina Village. Marina Village is being redeveloped as mixed-income housing and this pilot project will ensure that it is developed in a way that significantly reduces flood risk for the low and moderate income residents who will live there. It will include an extension and elevation of Johnson Street to provide dry egress from the redevelopment and access for emergency responders during acute storm events. Alongside Johnson Street, the project will construct a stormwater park that will capture, store, and manage stormwater from the redevelopment of Marina Village and some adjacent roadways and properties and delay its discharge, via a pump, into a new stormwater outfall in Cedar Creek. This green and grey infrastructure system will reduce flood risk during some chronic rain events and serve to create an MS4 (municipal separate stormwater sewer system) in a portion of the South End where the sanitary and stormwater sewers are presently combined.

Location Description:

Areas most impacted by superstorm Sandy located in Fairfield County, New Haven County, Middlesex County, New London County and the Mashantucket Pequot Indian Reservation.

Activity Progress Narrative:

The joint Environmental Impact statement covering both the National Disaster Resilience-funded activities and the RBD pilot project in the same neighborhood advanced significantly during this quarter. The final scoping document was finalized, incorporating public and HUD comments.
