



Accuracy Matters!

Your employer tells the Connecticut Department of Labor (CTDOL) how much you are paid, so it is important to report your earnings accurately during weeks that you claim unemployment benefits to avoid a potential overpayment.

Don't risk losing your UI benefits by reporting incorrect earnings! You may have to repay the money or face serious penalties.

Useful Tips



Report all your earnings every week if you work while claiming UI benefits, even if you only work part time.



Report the money you earn in the week that you work and earn it, not the week you get paid (unless it is the same).



Report your **GROSS** earnings (the amount you earn before taxes and other deductions are taken out), not your **NET** earnings (your take-home pay).



The sample paystub below is for a two-week pay period ending August 14. If you make \$20 per hour and work 15 hours each week of the two-week pay period, your gross earnings for the week ending August 7 are \$300 ($\$20 \times 15 = \300). Remember to report the \$300 in the week you worked and earned it.
