



**East Hartford and Willington
Design-Build Bridge Bundle along I-84 and Route 2
Biweekly Look-Ahead
Period of August 10, 2018 to August 24, 2018**



Throughout the weeks covered by this look-ahead, The Middlesex Corporation, CTDOT's contractor for the Design-Build Bridge Bundle Project, will continue construction operations.

East Hartford

Work will be performed in the project area during the standard working hours of 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

Phase 2 demolition will begin on Tuesday, August 14 and continue through Saturday, August 18 during standard working hours.

During the week of August 20, following the completion of Phase 2 demolition, backwalls, bearing seats and pier caps will be formed and poured, and rebar will be installed. Off site, steel girders will be assembled into pairs in preparation for installation.

Willington

Work will be performed in the project area during the daytime working hours of 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM and the nighttime working hours of 9:00 PM and 6:00 AM.

During the week of August 13, the forming, rebar, and pouring of wingwalls, which began on August 2, will continue. The installation of bridge fence and deck membrane, and the replacement of barriers in the median of I-84 will also take place throughout the week.

The bridge deck and approaches will be paved beginning on Friday, August 17 and lasting through Saturday, August 18. On Sunday, August 19, and Monday, August 20, bridge joints will be installed.

During the week of August 20, metal beam rail and lane markings will be installed.

The opening of the Potter School Road Bridge to traffic is scheduled to take place on Friday, August 24.

Lane closures are necessary to create a safe work zone; drivers are asked to be aware of possible lane closures for their own safety and that of the project team. Please also note that all work is contingent upon the weather.
