

East Hartford and Willington Design-Build Bridge Bundle along I-84 and Route 2 Biweekly Look-Ahead Period of July 27, 2018 to August 10, 2018



Throughout the weeks covered by this look-ahead, The Middlesex Corporation, CTDOT's contractor for the Design-Build Bridge Bundle Project, will continue construction operations.

East Hartford

Work will be performed in the project area during the standard working hours of 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

During the week of July 30, the deck and approaches of the new bridge will be paved. Beginning on Friday, August 3, and lasting through Saturday, August 4, temporary barriers will be set and bolted in preparation for the start of Phase 2 of the project.

During the week of August 6, the bridge barriers that were installed as part of Phase 1 of the project will be removed, and the approach barriers and traffic will be moved onto the new bridge. Traffic is anticipated to be moved onto the new bridge on August 9.

Willington

Work will be performed in the project area during the daytime working hours of 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM and the nighttime working hours of 9:00 PM and 6:00 AM.

During the week of July 30, the forming, rebar and pouring of the transverse deck sections and parapet areas, which began the week of July 23, will continue. Work on the parapet areas will continue through Saturday, August 4.

The forming, rebar, and pouring of wingwalls will begin on August 2, and continue through Saturday, August 4. This work will resume on Monday, August 6, and last throughout the week.

During the week of August 6, approach slabs will be excavated, and new approach slabs will be formed, poured and have rebar installed. Bridge fence will also be installed throughout the week.

Lane closures are necessary to create a safe work zone; drivers are asked to be aware of possible lane closures for their own safety and that of the project team. Please also note that all work is contingent upon the weather.
