SENATE BILL #310 & 330

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARY LINE BETWEEN CONNECTICUT AND MASSACHUSETTS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

SECTION 1. The boundary line between the state of Connecticut and the commonwealth of Massachusetts, from the northwest corner of Rhode Island to the northwest corner of Connecticut, is as follows: Beginning at a granite monument at the northwest corner of the state of Rhode Island and marking the corner of Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Connecticut, in latitude 42° 00' 29.150" and longitude 71° 47 ' 58.778"; thence north 2° 56' 41 " west, 2,795 feet to a granite monument on the northerly side of the old turnpike from Hartford to Boston through Thompson and Douglas, in latitude 42° 00' 56.728" and longitude 71° 48' 00.680"; thence north 5° 13' 32" west, 2,854 feet to a granite monument at the northeast corner of the state of Connecticut, in latitude 42° 01' 24.807" and longitude 71° 48' 04.123"; thence north 89° 09' 56" west, 27,908 feet to a granite monument on the westerly side of Webster road, opposite the "Line Hotel" in latitude 42° 01' 28.656" and longitude 71° 54' 13.830"; thence north 87° 52' 26" west, 22,881 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of the road from East Woodstock to Southbridge in latitude 42° 01' 36.931" and longitude 71° 59' 16.780"; thence north 89° 17' 16" west 22,890 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of Forge road from Woodstock Valley to Southbridge, in latitude 42° 01' 39.631" and longitude 72° 04' 20.037"; thence north 86° 52' 14" west, 19,423 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of the main road from Mashapaug, to Holland, in latitude 42° 01′ 50.026" and longitude 72° 08′ 37.006"; thence north 89° 17' 26" west, 53,162 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of the road from Stafford to Monson by the east base of Peaked Mountain, in latitude 42° 01' 55.929" and longitude 72° 20' 21.364"; thence north 87° 56' 26" west, 4,029 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of the road from Stafford to Hampden, in latitude 42° 01' 57.356" and longitude 72° 21' 14.722"; thence north 89° 11' 36" west, 10.377 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of the road from Stafford to Hampden by the east base of Rattlesnake Mountain, in latitude 42° 01' 58.779" and longitude 72° 23' 32.206"; thence north 88° 23' 38" west, 18,542 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of the road from North Somers to East Longmeadow, in latitude 42° 02' 03.840" and longitude 72° 27' 37.808"; thence south 89° 39' 56" west, 8,747 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of the Hall Hill road from Somers to East Longmeadow, in latitude 42° 02' 03.319" and longitude 72° 29' 33.716"; thence north 89° 16' 52" west, 10,684 feet to a granite monument at the corner of the towns of East Longmeadow and Longmeadow in Massachusetts and Enfield in Connecticut, in latitude 42°02' 04.619" and longitude 72° 31' 55.276" thence south 81° 56' 34" west, 11,309 feet to a granite monument about 620 feet south of Allen Street in Longmeadow in latitude 42° 01' 48.933" and longitude 72° 34' 23.644"; thence south 51° 56' 28" west, 3,238 feet to a granite monument 450 feet east of the main road from Thompsonville to Springfield in latitude 42° 01' 29.212" and longitude 72° 34' 57.422"; thence north 88° 35' 49" west, 5,834 feet to a granite monument on the top of the


bank, about 175 feet east of the easterly shore of the Connecticut River, in latitude 42° 01' 30.616" and longitude 72° 36' 14.696"; thence in the same direction, 950 feet to the middle of said river; thence northerly along a line midway between the banks thereof, about 2,075 feet; thence north 87° 18' 55" west, 1,260 feet to a granite monument standing on the bank about 225 feet west of the westerly shore of the river, in latitude 42° 01' 51.983" and longitude 72° 36' 44.913"; thence in the same direction, 7,661 feet to a granite monument about 875 feet west of North Street or Suffield Street, the middle road from Suffield to Springfield, in latitude 42° 01' 55.516" and longitude 72° 38' 26.318"; thence north 82° 39' 40" west, 8,966 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of Halliday Avenue or Front Street, the road from Suffield to Feeding Hills, in latitude 42° 02' 06.813" and longitude 72° 40' 24.149"; thence north 84° 51' 12" west, 7,202 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of West Street, the road from West Suffield to Westfield, in latitude 42° 02' 13.185" and longitude 72° 41' 59.207"; thence south 89° 46' 25" west, 4,137 feet to a granite monument at the corner of Agawam and Southwick in Massachusetts and Suffield in Connecticut, in latitude 42° 02' 13.019" and longitude 72° 42' 54.032"; thence south 0° 48' 01" east, 132 feet to a granite monument, in latitude 42° 02' 11.716" and longitude 72° 42' 54.008"; thence south 89° 38' 09" west, 11,231 feet to a granite monument on the easterly shore of Congamond Lake, in latitude 42° 02' 10.984" and longitude 72° 45' 22.830"; thence in the same direction, 14.5 feet to the shore of the lake as it would be with the surface of the water at the elevation it was in 1803; thence southerly, by the easterly shore of the lake as it would be with the surface of the water at the aforesaid elevation to a point opposite a granite monument near the shore at the southerly end of the lake(the elevation of the water surface of the lake in 1803 has been determined to be one foot below the top surface of the southwest corner of the brownstone foundation, or footing of the north abutment of the arched culvert carrying the tracks of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad Company over the outlet of the lake about 900 feet north of Congamond Lake railroad station); thence south 4° 26'29" west, about 25 feet to said monument, in latitude 42° 00' 27.957" and longitude 72° 46' 00.167"; thence in the same direction, 1,632 feet to a granite monument at the southeasterly corner of the "Southwick jog", in latitude 42° 00' 11.881" and longitude 72° 46' 01.841"; thence south 81° 33' 28" west, 13,827 feet to a granite monument at the southwesterly corner of the "Southwick jog", in latitude 41° 59' 51.787" and longitude 72° 49' 02.976" thence north 3° 33' 56" east, 14,261 feet to a granite monument known as the "Crank monument", in latitude 42° 02' 12.399" and longitude 72° 48' 51.223"; thence north 88° 46' 28" west, 16,177 feet to a granite monument about 325 feet east of the west road from Granby to Granvillle, in latitude 42° 02' 15.762" and longitude 72° 52' 25.548"; thence south 89° 48' 02" west, 17,833 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of the road near the east bank of Hubbard Brook, in latitude 42° 02' 15.081" and longitude 72° 56' 21.859"; thence north 88° 32' 56" west, 26,579 feet to a granite monument on the easterly side of the road near the west bank of Slocum Brook, in latitude 42° 02' 21.580" and longitude 73° 02' 13.967"; thence north 87° 33' 48" west, 26,817 feet to a granite monument on the westerly side of the road near the westerly bank of Sandis Brook, in latitude 42° 02' 32.691" and longitude 73° 08' 09.034"; thence north 87° 52' 12" west, 26,698 feet to a granite monument on a large rock near the westerly bank of a brook about 300 feet south of its mouth at Whiting River near Campbell Falls, in latitude 42° 02' 42.342" and longitude 73° 14' 02.615"; thence north 87° 35' 41" west, 28,917 feet to a granite monument near the easterly bank of the Housatonic River, in latitude 42° 02' 54.154" and longitude 73° 20' 25.540"; thence north 88° 07' 02" west, 25,250 feet to a granite monument on a large rock


marked 1803 on its southerly side, in Sage's ravine, in latitude 42° 03' 02.214" and longitude 73° 26' 00.030"; thence south 88° 31' 58" west 14,787 feet to a granite monument at the northwesterly corner of the state of Connecticut and marking the corner of Massachusetts, New York and Connecticut, in latitude 42° 02' 58.427" and longitude 73° 29' 15.959".


SECTION 2. The geodetic positions given in this description are based on Clark's spheroid and the astronomical data adopted by the United States coast and geodetic survey in 1880.


SECTION 3. The above-described boundary line is shown on plans dated December 26, 1906, deposited with the librarian of the state of Connecticut and with the secretary of the state of Massachusetts, with additional copies filed with the secretary of the state of Connecticut and the harbor and land commissioners of the state of Massachusetts.

SECTION 4. The governor is authorized and requested to transmit a copy of this act to the governor of the state of Massachusetts, and upon receiving acknowledgment of its receipt by the State of Massachusetts the governor shall cause such acknowledgement to be filed in the office of the secretary.

Bound is an unmarked point in the Connecticut River at the Enfield-Suffield town corner and an angle in the State Line.

FARM ROAD

From the State Line, on Route U.S. 5, at Bound #97, proceed southerly on Route U.S. 5 to Bernadino Avenue, at 0.45 mile.

Following sketch proceed westerly and northerly on farm roads. At fork, just east of remains of a boat yard, turn north to the remains of the Wilmes homestead.

Bound is located 42 feet south of the southeast corner of the foundation of the remains of the Wilmes homestead on range of its east face. It is 30 feet east of the river bank and 175 feet east of the east shore of the Connecticut River. Homestead clearing is surrounded by woodland.

Bound is a witness mark for the angle and town corner at Bound #100-A in the center of the river.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.9 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the east, "L Mass." on the north and "E Conn." on the south face. It is 9.4 feet long, set in excavation made in sand, its bottom resting on rock. Monument was set June 15, 1907, in the exact location of the old 1826 sandstone monument.

INTERIOR TOWN CORNER

From the State Line on Route 159, at Bound #102, proceed northerly on Route 159, 150 feet to Kanawha Avenue. Proceed easterly on Kanawha Avenue 0.25 mile.

Bound is located about 75 feet south of a one-story ranch house, #104 (Raymond P. Geddis), on the south side of Kanawha Avenue. Kanawha Avenue turns 90 degrees north just past house #104. Bound is 230 feet west of the west shoreline of the Connecticut River. All top corners of Bound are chipped, with a large chip on the southwest corner. Bound is tipped slightly to the northeast.

Bound is a witness mark for the angle and town corner at Bound #100-B in the center of the river.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.7 feet above ground level. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "A Mass." on the north, and "S Conn." On the south face. It is 9.5 feet long, set in excavation made in loam and sandy clay. Bound was set June 17, 1907.

REGULATION GRANITE MONUMENT

PAVED HIGHWAY

From the intersection of Mapleton Avenue and Route 159, proceed northerly on Route 159 to Bound at 0.8 mile. Road is descending gradually, northerly, and levels off about 300 feet north of the Bound.

Bound is located 37 feet east of the center of the traveled way. It is 3.5 feet west of the east highway fence and opposite its intersection with a line fence running east. Bound is 3 feet north of a 36-inch maple. Level cultivated fields lie southeast of the Bound with "Drewnowski Swimming Pool Company" to the northeast and a farmstead on the west side of the highway directly opposite the Bound.

Bound was marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.9 feet above ground. It was lettered "1906" on the west, "A Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It was 9.5 feet long, set in excavation made in reddish sand. Monument was set June 17, 1907.

In October 1979, Bound was reported broken off. It was found that the monument was broken off at an angle 11 inches below the ground level measured at the center of the monument.

The repair was accomplished on November 9, 1979 by drilling four holes 3 inches deep and inserting ½ inch steel deformed bars 12 inches long. Concrete was then poured into a form 14 inches square and 12 inches deep to a level one inch above the existing ground.

A bronze disk with the words "State Line Bound Mass/Conn 102" was inserted in the center of the concrete. A drill hole was placed in the center of the disk.

SMALL SANDSTONE MONUMENT

INTERIOR LINE SUMMIT

From the State Line on North Street (Route 75) at Bound #104, proceed easterly on line uphill, between cultivated fields 177 feet to Bound at summit.

Bound is located at the absolute summit of a low hill lying immediately east of, and parallel to, North Street, in an ivy and sumac covered property line between cultivated fields. It is 32 feet west of a 30-inch hickory tree. Bound is 51 feet south of the face of a wood frame house, #1685, and is 9.2 feet west of an intersection of chain link fences. Bound is 2 feet west of a 9-inch square sandstone monument which leans east at an angle of 45 degrees, which marks a property line. There are traces of a wire fence evident along property line.

Bound is marked by a sandstone monument showing 0.9 feet above ground. It is 9 inches by 12 inches in section with a ¾ inch drill hole one inch deep in top and is lettered "M State Line" on the north and "C State Line 1803" on the south face. Drill hole has been filled (with lead) and prick punched by an unknown party. Bound is 5.0 feet long, set in excavation made in reddish sand. Monument was set June 18, 1907.

REGULATION GRANITE MONUMENT

PAVED HIGHWAY

From the intersection of North Street (Route 75) and Hickory Street, north of Suffield, proceed northerly on North Street to Bound at 0.3 mile. Road descends gradually, northerly, with open woodland dropping away on the west and rising northerly to a residence with scrub brush on the east, to a high point east of the Bound.

Bound is located 26 feet east of the center of the traveled way in sloping cut bank. It is 2.39 feet west of the center of a granite monument, tipped westerly, marking a Suffield highway bound, and 3 feet east of a triangular project marker shown on photograph. Brush land rises to the east of the Bound and open woodland descends gradually west of the highway. A residence, #1685 lies 100 feet \pm to the northeast of Bound.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.0 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "A Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It is 9.5 feet long set in excavation made in reddish sand and gravel. Monument was set June 18, 1907.

REGULATION GRANITE MONUMENT

INTERIOR ANGLE

From the State Line on North Street (Route 75) at Bound #104, proceed westerly on line across cultivated land and marsh swale, 901 feet to Bound.

Bound is located on a low bluff west of a brook and is 22.4 feet southwest of a 15 inch oak which is an angle point in a wire fence at the southeast corner of a golf course (Crestview Country Club, Agawam, Mass.). The Bound is surrounded by second growth woodland with undulating cultivated fields and open pastures beyond the second growth woodland.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.9 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the east, "A Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. Bound is tipped slightly to the north with a small chip in the southeast top corner and a chip in the northwest corner 2.3 feet below the top. Bound is 10.0 feet long, set in excavation made in loam and clay. Monument was set June 18, 1907.

LINE BOUND #106 A

Line Bound 106 A is a Regulation Granite Monument, which was set on September 26, 1990.

It replaces Line Bound 106 which was a dressed sandstone monument 9 inches by 12 inches in section, with a 5/8-inch drill hole 1 inch deep in depression in top and lettered "M" State Line 1803" on the north and "C State Line" on the south face. It was 5.2 feet long, set in an excavation made in clay. Bound was set on June 19, 1907. Due to the original sandstone bounds numerous disturbances by farm equipment, it was replaced by Regulation Granite Bound 106 A. The top 2 feet of the original bound was donated to the Suffield Historical Society. Please refer to the 1985 – 1986 Perambulation Report for further historic details regarding the demise of the original sandstone monument.

Regulation Granite Bound 106 A is set in a wooded area 347 feet westerly of the former sandstone bound 106 location to avoid future disturbance. Regulation Granite Bound 106 A is marked as follows: The north face is lettered MASS, the south face is lettered CONN, and the west face is numbered 1990. There is a chip in the northwest corner of the replaced regulation monument. It is 12 inches x 12 inches with a 5/8 inch drill hole 1 inch deep in the top. It is marked on the north face by the letters "MASS" and on the south face by letters "CONN" and on the west face by numbers "1990". The Bound is 9 feet long and protrudes 4 feet above the surface of the ground.


From the State Line on North Street (Route 75) at Bound #104, proceed northerly to Shoemaker Lane at 0.8 mile. Proceed westerly on Shoemaker Lane to golf course road (Crestview Country Club) at 1.5 miles. Proceed south on road to clubhouse and service road at 2.0 miles. After obtaining permission from the golf course superintendent, following sketch, proceed southerly on service road passing a maintenance garage and golf course on both sides, to an intersection of service roads at 2.2 miles. Proceed westerly 335 feet passing a pond and crossing a wire fence to Bound.

SMALL SAND STONE MONUMENT

INTERIOR LINE SUMMIT

From the State Line on South Westfield Street or Halladay Avenue, at Bound #108, proceed easterly on line across lawn ascending easterly to Bound, 114 feet east of Bound #108.

Bound is located at the line summit at the westerly brow of the southerly slope of a knoll. There is lawn to the north and a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -story Cape Cod dwelling about 30 feet south of the Bound, and level land to the east, sloping away to the south and west and rising to the north.

Bound is marked by a dressed sandstone monument 8 inches by 12 inches in section, with ½-inch drill hole 1 ½ inches deep in the top, showing 1.7 feet above ground. It is lettered "Mass. State Line 1803" on the north and "C State Line" on the south face. It is 5.2 feet long, set in excavation made in red gravel. It was set June 18, 1907.

In April, 1987, the Bound was found to be tipped to the south and loose, possibly broken off below grade. Bound is weathered and has numerous chips.

On September 11, 1990, Bound was replumbed and a concrete collar formed around the broken area. The top of the concrete collar is 3 inches above the ground.

PAVED HIGHWAY

From the intersection of Route 187 and Barry Street, proceed easterly to intersection with South Westfield Street at Bound at 0.7 mile. Highway after crossing brook rises gradually, easterly, to the intersection.

Bound is located 32 feet east of the center of the traveled way of South Westfield Street, also known as Halladay Avenue, opposite the southerly gutter of Barry Street. Residential land rises east of the Bound and descends west of the highway. There is a residence about 200 feet northeast of the Bound. There is a 1½ story cape cod dwelling 100± feet southeast of Bound, and a 2 story colonial dwelling on the west side of Halladay Avenue, 100± feet southwest of Bound. CL&P Pole #17999 is 19.5 feet south of Bound.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 4.2 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "A Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It is 9.8 feet long, set in excavation made in loam and 3.8 feet in hardpan. It was set June 18, 1907, in the exact location of the old 1803 granite monument.

ABANDONED RAILROAD


From the State Line on Route 187, at Bound #110, proceed easterly on line between newly constructed church to the north and a residence to the south, to the top of railroad cut. Continue to the bottom of cut and Bound at 275 feet east of Bound #110.

Bound is located 25 feet west of the center of the abandoned C.N.E.R.R. right of way in a cut about 850 feet south of the Barry Street bridge and about 450 feet north of a brook crossing the right of way. Level light woods are east and west of the cut. A new house now lies 100+ feet southwest of the monument.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.6 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "A Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It is 9.8 feet long, set in excavation made in sand. Monument was set June 22, 1907.

In April 1987, Bound was recovered in good condition and tipped slightly to the east.

PAVED HIGHWAY

From the intersection of Route 187 and Barry Street, proceed southerly on Route 187 to Bound at 0.2 mile. The highway runs straight, ascending slightly, southerly, and drops off abruptly 200 feet south of the Bound.

Bound is located 20 feet east of the center of the traveled way. Level scrub woodland to the east and west of the highway and north of the line. A small barn lies opposite the Bound, west of the highway and south of the line. A residence lies $150 \pm 150 \pm 1$


Bound was marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.2 feet above ground. It was lettered "1906" on the west, "A Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It was 9.4 feet long, set in excavation made in sand. Monument was set June 19, 1907.

Bound was reported to be broken off 13 inches below ground level on November 8, 1973.

The repair was accomplished on November 14, 1979, by drilling four holes 3 inches deep and inserting ½ inch steel deformed bars 15 inches long. Concrete was then poured into a form 14 inches square and 15 inches deep to a level 2 inches above the existing ground.

A bronze disk with the words "State Line Bound Mass/Conn 110" was inserted in the center of the concrete. A drill hole was placed in the center of the disk.

SMALL SANDSTONE MONUMENT

INTERIOR LINE SUMMIT

From the State Line on the highway running south from Shea Corner, at Bound #112, proceed easterly on line up grade along north side of yard of residence, 110 feet to Bound.

Bound is located at the line summit, at the side yard of a frame house standing about 60 feet south of the Bound. A 1 ½ story frame house (#861 E.J. Hart residence) is about 75 feet north of the Bound. A wire fence running east-west touches south face of Bound. Northwest and southwest corners of Bound are severely chipped with lesser chips on other corners.

Bound is marked by a dressed sandstone monument showing 1.0 foot above ground. It is 9 inches by 12 inches in section, with a 5/8 inch drill hole 1 ½ inches deep in the top and is lettered "M State Line 1803" on the north and "C State Line" on the south face. It is 4.6 feet long, set in excavation made in loam and 2.6 feet in ledge. Monument was set June 20, 1907.


PAVED HIGHWAY

From the intersection of Route 187 and Barry Street, proceed westerly on Barry Street to intersection 205 at Shea Corner at 0.8 mile. Proceed southerly on South West Street to Bound at 1.1 miles. Highway crosses brook 400 feet north of the line, rises gradually, southerly, and curves to the west from the brook to the Bound where it straightens out and levels off to the south.

Bound is located 24 feet east of the center of the traveled way. It is 2.3 feet west of an 8 inch by 8 inch rock faced granite monument showing 1.8 feet above ground, severely tipped to the northwest, lettered "H" on the west face and marking a Suffield highway bound. Bound is 80 feet southwest of a 1 ½ story frame house, #861, E.J. Hart residence. There is a story-and-a-half residence on a knoll (#1646) about 100 feet southeast of the Bound. Land rises to the east with residences north of the line, and drops off abruptly west of the highway to level, scrub oak woods.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.6 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "A Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It is 10.1 feet long, set in excavation made in brown sandy clay. Monument was set June 19, 1907, in the exact location of the old 1803 sandstone monument.

From the Village of Rising Corner, proceed northeasterly on paved road (Barry Street) 400 feet to Bound. Highway is rising slightly, northeasterly, to a high point opposite the Bound.

Bound is located 22 feet southeast of the center of the traveled way. Level cultivated land in all directions, with a residence 66 feet west of the Bound on the opposite side of the highway.

Bound was marked by a regulation granite monument, showing 3.3 feet above ground. It was lettered "1906" on the west, "A Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It was 8.9 feet long, set in excavation made in sandy loam. Monument was set June 20, 1907.

In 1975, perambulation Bound was found broken off 1 foot below ground level. The lower section is 1 foot north of a 3-inch iron pipe projecting 2 ¼ feet. According to a local resident, the top section was knocked over by an auto in 1972.

The repair was accomplished on November 14, 1979, by drilling four holes 3 inches deep and inserting ½ inch steel deformed bars 13 inches long. Concrete was then poured into a form 14 inches square and 12 inches deep to a level 1 inch above the existing ground.

A bronze disk with the words "State Line Bound Mass-Conn 113" was inserted in the center of the concrete. A drill hole was placed in the center of the disk.

From the Village of Rising Corner, proceed northwesterly on paved road (Rising Corner Road) 360 feet to Bound. Highway crosses a brook 300 feet southeast of the Bound and runs straight, ascending northwesterly to a summit 50 feet beyond the Bound.

Bound is located 28 feet northeast of the center of the traveled way. A lawn slopes down easterly from the Bound with scrub woodland dropping away southwest of the highway. There is a two-story residence 75 feet southeast of the Bound. Woodland rises northwest of Bound. All top corners of Bound are slightly chipped.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.2 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "A Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It is 9.2 feet long, set in excavation made in loam and 3 feet in ledge. Monument was set June 20, 1907.

Bound is located 18 feet west of the center of an abandoned farm road which descends through woodland to the north. Woodland drops off to the west with lawns rising to the south, with lawn rising slightly then dropping off to the east. Three hundred feet \pm to the south is a residence (#1605 Rising Corner Road West Suffield).

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.8 feet above ground. It is lettered "A 1906" on the east, "S Mass." on the west, "Mass." on the

north and "S Conn." on the south face. It is 9.3 feet long, set in excavation made in sandy hardpan. Monument was set on June 20, 1907, in the exact location of the old 1803 sandstone monument.



There is a 2-story frame house at the top of a knoll 150 feet south of the Bound. It is in a boulder embedded in the ground and showing a 3-foot by 1 ¼-foot top, 6 to 8 inches above ground.

Bound is marked by a 5/8-inch drill hole 2 inches deep, sloping to the northwest, enclosed in a 2 ½-inch countersunk square near the eastern slope of the top of the boulder.

Bound is located 23 feet southeast of the center of the traveled way. Cultivated fields slope gently away from the highway on the west, with scrub brush rising slightly on the east. A residence lies 200 ± 100 feet to the northeast with a residence lying 300 ± 100 feet southwesterly of Bound. All top corners and edges are slightly chipped. Road descends slightly to the south, past the Bound.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.6 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "S Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It is 9.5 feet long, set in excavation made in sandy loam and red gravel. Monument was set June 21, 1907.

From the State Line on Warner Town Road at Bound #117, proceed southwesterly along Warner Town Road to a gravel drive on right at 0.2 mile. Proceed northwesterly on gravel drive to fork at 0.25 mile. Proceed northwesterly from fork along drive to a fork at 0.65 mile. Proceed northwesterly from fork to end of a gravel drive at 0.75 mile and Garrison style house at the top of the northerly summit of Huckleberry Mountain.

From the northeast corner of the range line of the Garrison house, proceed 191 feet north, then 26 feet east to the Bound. Bound is located 4 feet south of a line fence at the wooded northerly summit of Huckleberry Mountain. Woodland drops away in all directions. With line cleared it would see Bounds #116 and #117 to the east and Bounds #119 and #120 to the west.

Bound is marked by a dressed sandstone monument showing 1.2 feet above ground. It is 9 inches by 12 inches in section with a ¾-inch drill hole one inch deep in top and is lettered "M State Line 1803" on the north and "C State Line" on the south face. It is 5.1 feet long. 

All top corners of Bound are chipped.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 2.6 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "S Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It is 8.9 feet long, set in excavation made in yellow loam and red sand. Monument was set June 21, 1907.

From the State Line on the east shore of Congamond Lakes, at Bound #121, proceed easterly on paved driveway in the bottom of a hollow, a distance of 200 feet. Proceed southerly up bank at right angles to paved driveway, 110 feet to Bound.

Bound is located at the westerly brow of a wooded plain, between wood road to the south and paved driveway to the north, leading west from Grove Road to cottages along the east shore of Congamond Lakes. Brushy woodland, level to the east and south, drops off to the west and north. Westerly and northwesterly are residences.

Bound is 12 feet north of an electric power line running east and west. Top northeast and northwest corners have large chips, with a smaller chip on top southwest corner.

Bound is marked by a dressed sandstone monument showing 0.9 feet above ground. It is 9 inches by 9 inches in section, with a ¾ inch drill hole one inch deep in the top and is lettered "M State Line" on the north and "C State Line" on the south face. From the State Line on Grove Road, at Bound #119, proceed northerly on Grove Road 400 feet to intersecting paved road. Proceed westerly on paved road, taking northerly fork immediately after leaving highway and westerly at 0.2 mile, following along bottom of hollow to rear of residence, on east shore of Congamond Lakes at 0.3 mile. Proceed westerly, passing south of residence to lake shore and Bound.

Bound is located at the water's edge at the southwest corner of a wooden deck. Bound is hidden from the east by the wooden deck and is on the center line of the hollow to the east. During the 1986 Perambulation, the Bound was found to be leaning several inches to the west, due to lake shore erosion. Bound shows 5.5 feet above ground. Due to continuing water action and shore erosion the condition of this Bound will deteriorate unless corrective action is taken.

Bound is a witness mark for the angle at Bound #121-A, 15 feet to the west in the lake.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 5.5 feet (4.2 feet originally above ground). It is lettered "1906" on the east, "S Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. It is set in excavation made in sandy gravel. Original monument was set June 21, 1907, in the exact location of the old 1803 sandstone monument. On the 1915 Perambulation, it was found broken in three pieces. The present monument, cut in accordance with the original specifications, was set December 19, 1915, in the exact location of the undisturbed base of the original monument.

The line from Bound #121-A to Bound #121-B is defined as "the easterly shore of the lake as it would be with the surface of the water at the elevation it was in 1803."


The elevation of the water surface of the lake in 1803 has been determined to be one foot below the top surface of the southwest corner of the brownstone foundation, or footing, of the north abutment of the arched culvert carrying the tracks of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad Company over the outlet of the lake (#121-A Reference Point) about 900 feet north along railroad tracks from their intersection with Connecticut Route #168 (Mountain Road).


ANGLE BOUND#121-B

From the intersection of Copper Hill Road and Phelps Road, southeast of Congamond Lakes, proceed northerly on to intersecting Griffin Road at 0.75 mile. Following sketch, proceed westerly on Griffin Road to a point where highway turns 90 degrees southerly at 1.65 miles. Proceed southerly 50 feet to intersecting paved private road, turn westerly on private road descending and jogging northerly, and then westerly to small parking area at private beach. Bound is on east side of grass area south of beach and north of parking area.

Bound is located at the south edge of the beach in the north edge of the bushes lying east of the cleared land in front of the cottage. Woodland rises to the east and south with cottages close by on both sides. Bound is tipped slightly south with all top corners and edges slightly chipped.

Bound is a witness mark for the angle at Bound #121-B, 38 feet to the north in the lake.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.6 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the south, "S Mass." on the west and "S Conn." on the east face. It is 9.9 feet long, set in excavation made in sand and backfilled with concrete. Monument was originally set June 24, 1907, in the exact location of the old 1803 sandstone monument. Some time before 1910, it was pushed over by ice, and on November 22, 1915, it was reset 13.20 feet further south on line in a larger concrete base.

Following sketch, from Bound #122 on the southerly end of Congamond Lakes (South Pond) proceed 184 feet southerly, crossing paved road up a wooded steep slope onto a lawn east of residence (#560 Griffin Road) to Bound.

Bound is located in lawn east of the cottage. It is 10.20 feet from the southeast corner of the cottage, 9.50 feet at right angles to the base board, and 27.26 feet from the northeast corner of the front porch. The east face of the cottage measures 29.50 feet, corner to corner, including the porch.

Bound was marked by a dressed, sandstone monument 9 inches by 12 inches in section, originally 5.0 feet long and set with 1.0 foot showing above ground, broken off with the top of the remaining base 4 inches below ground surface. It is set in excavation made 1 ½ feet in sandy loam and 2 ½ feet in sharp sand. Monument was set June 25, 1907. In the fall of 1927, a truck backed into the monument and broke it off at ground level. It was further damaged by a bulldozer during grading operations in 1950.

On the 1965 perambulation, the monument was found in the same condition described above on a prior perambulation. In March 1966, a survey was run from monument #122 to monument #124 to determine the line. In September 1967, monument #123 was reset on line between #122 and #124.

The monument was repaired by straightening the original base of the monument. A 1 ½ foot collar of concrete 13 inches by 16 inches was then poured around the top foot of the base to make it flush with the ground. A bronze disk 3 inches in diameter with "State Line" inscribed on it was inserted in the concrete in its correct position on the line. Disk is 3 inches below surface of lawn.

From the intersection of Copper Hill Road and Phelps Road, southeast of Congamond Lakes, proceed northerly on Copper Hill Road to intersection of Griffin Road at 0.75 mile. Proceed westerly on Griffin Road to a point where the highway turns 90 degrees southerly at 1.65 miles. Following sketch, proceed southerly to the intersection with a gravel field road at 1.7 miles. Continue southerly on gravel field road passing between tobacco fields on both sides to a "T" intersection at 1.9 miles. Proceed westerly on field drive to bound at 2.0 miles.

Bound is located in open second growth woodland south of Congamond Lakes. Tobacco tents lie north of Bound and farm road. Nearly level land in all directions. All top corners of Bound are slightly chipped.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.8 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "S Mass." on the north, "S Conn." on the east and "S Conn." on the south face. It is 10.0 feet long set in excavation made in sandy gravel. Monument was set June 24, 1907, in the exact location of the 1803 sandstone monument.

From the underpass on Phelps Road, at the abandoned Northampton division of the N.Y., N.H. and H. R.R., Bound is located 1930 feet northerly on railroad right of way.

From the intersection of Phelps Road and Quarry Road proceed northerly on Quarry Road to dirt drive at 0.15 mile. Proceed easterly on dirt drive 125 feet to intersecting dirt road just west of abandoned railroad bed. Proceed northerly on dirt road following railroad bed 1100 feet to the remains of a small bridge over the outlet from a swamp lying west of the right of way behind the Bound. Proceed 85 feet north to Bound.

Bound is 30 feet west of the centerline of the railroad bed, from which the rails and ties are removed. A wooden witness post (#307) for underground cable is 10 feet east of Bound. Low brushy swamp land on both sides of the right of way. Bound leans to the southeast and has a large chip on the southeast corner.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 4.0 (5.0 in 1986) feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "S Mass." on the north and "S Conn." on the south face. There is no drill hole and a rough cross has been cut in the top. There is a 4-inch chip in the southeast corner. It is 8.8 feet long, set in a 6-foot square excavation on three 8-inch by 16-inch timbers 5 feet long, laid flat, east and west on top of four equal timbers laid north and south, with 6 inches of gravel bedding under base of monument. Top of the timber crib is 2.6 feet below the old ground surface. The entire excavation was filled with gravel and mounded up around the monument and paved 2 feet wide with cobbles.

From the intersection of Phelps Road and Quarry Road, east of the northerly brow of Manitick Mountain, proceed northerly and westerly around the northerly end of Manitick Mountain to wood road to the southwest at town line at 0.5 mile.

Town line crosses Quarry Road, about 100 feet west of the east end of the long, straight and level section of Quarry Road and opposite the east edge of a good wood road leading to the southwest. From the center of Quarry road, at the town line, proceed N 25 degrees E 450 feet along wire fence remains on the west and through tall pines to Bound. Traces of a former wood road which led to the Bound may be followed by the evidences of filling. Wire fence corner is 25 feet east of CL&P #2094.

Bound is located in the southerly edge of a brush swamp. Low, level scrubby woodland in all directions, with swampy growth to the north and taller trees to the east and south. The lower one foot of exposed Bound is below water line.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.9 feet above ground. It is lettered "G 1906" on the west, "S" on the east, "S Mass." on the north and "Conn." on the south face. It is 9.3 feet long, set in excavation made 2.3 feet in clay, 1.5 feet in tough clay and 1.5 feet in quicksand. Monument was set June 25, 1907. Small chips on corners and edges of Bound.

South 9.5 feet from the Bound is a granite monument showing 1.0 foot above ground, marking the Suffield-Granby town line. The top foot is dressed 8 inches by 8 inches, the rest is rock faced. It is furrowed diagonally across the top and is lettered "C S C" on the northeast, "1883" on the northwest, "S" on the southeast and "G" on the southwest face.

Bound is located 27 feet east of the center of the traveled way. Scrub brush drops off east of the Bound to a brook with cultivated land to the southeast. Cultivated land rises west of the highway; woodland to the northwest of highway. There is a filling station and residence about 150 feet north of the Bound.


Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument set flush with ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "S Mass." on the north and "G Conn." on the south face. It is 9.5 feet long, set in excavation made in sand. Monument was set June 26, 1907.

On the 1965 Perambulation, the monument was found to be leaning to the east. In May, 1967, a survey was run from monument #126 to monument #128 to determine the line. In June, 1967, the monument was reset on the line between monuments #126 and #128.

When straightening the monument, it was found to be broken off 3.2 feet from the top. The top portion was then placed on its base and a 1.5 foot thick concrete collar 2.5 feet in diameter was then placed around the break. About 1.5 feet of sand fill was then placed on top of the collar.

The monument is flush with surrounding area.

From the westerly edge of Route U.S. 202 near the southerly end of a parking lot located just north of a church proceed westerly 130 feet \pm , crossing a foot bridge over a small watercourse and passing just south of the parsonage to a fence corner, 40 feet \pm off range of north side of church, at the northeast corner of a parking lot. Continue westerly along fence 365 feet through woodland at the foot of the hill. Continue westerly along fence through open woods up hill 590 feet to an iron pipe at a fence to the north. Proceed northerly along fence 167 feet N 10 E to an iron pipe in the fence line, 3 feet north of a 20-inch hickory. Proceed N 80 W, 87 feet to line summit and Bound.

Bound is located at the southerly end of a flat hilltop in open woods, a little east of the line summit. It is 87 feet west of an iron pipe in a wire fence 167 feet north of its southerly end at a fence running east and west. Woodland, which is level for 100 feet north and south of the Bound, drops away beyond and in other directions. Bound is heavily damaged due to vandalism; the top half of the "1803 C" is chipped off.



Bound is located 15 feet east of the center of the traveled way and 2 feet east of a concrete town line sign post. Undulating cultivated fields on all sides slope away slightly to the south and east.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument, showing 3.9 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "S Mass." on the north, and "G Conn." on the south face. It is 8.9 feet long, set in excavation made in gravel. Monument was set June 26, 1907.

Proceed northerly to Bound, 85 feet north of the intersection. Cooley Road runs straight past Bound, ascending slightly, northerly, from the intersection.

Bound is located 20 feet east of the center of the traveled way and 36 feet south of the south end of the east highway wall. Relatively level cultivated land north and east of bound. A residence lies just west of Cooley Road west of Bound. A farm lies south of Bound along south side of East Street. Scrub woodland lies north of line west of Cooley Road.

Bound was marked by a regulation granite monument showing 4.0 feet above ground. It was lettered "1906" on the east, "S Mass." on the north, "G Conn." on the west and "G Conn." on the south face. It was 9.0 feet long, set in excavation made in sandy gravel. Monument was set June 26, 1907, in the exact location of the old 1803 sandstone monument.

In the winter of 1994-1995, the top 3 feet 9 inches of the Bound was broken off at ground level. The broken off monument piece was brought to the State of Connecticut, District IV Office, in Thomaston, Connecticut, in January, 1995, for storage.


On September 4, 1997, the broken off piece of monument was delivered to the Granby Historical Society by the State of Connecticut, District IV Survey Section, Thomaston, Connecticut.

On September 4, 1997, State of Connecticut, District IV Surveys, set a state line disc in the center of the remaining bottom section of the Bound. The bottom section was found to be in the same location as it was before it was broken off.

The disc was set and drilled with a 3/16 inch drill hole in the center of the disc and stamped 130. The disc also has "State Line" stamped on it and is 3 inches in diameter. Also see "Swing Tie" sketch.

The Bound is located 216 feet S 50 E degrees from a driveway entrance to House #32, Cooley Road (Cianfarani Residence). The Bound is on a knoll in a lawn and at east edge of a flower garden. Bound is 66 feet southeast of the southeast corner of 1 ½ story house and 80 feet southeast of the southwest corner of house. Scrub woodland drops off to the east, as do pastures and cultivated land to the south and on the west of the highway. Top corners and edges of Bound are chipped.

House #27 is located on east side of Heather Lane in a residential development. From the northeast corner of a four bay attached garage of house #27, proceed easterly on northerly range of garage, 220 feet across lawn and into open woodland to line. Proceed southerly 15 feet to Bound. Bound is located at the line summit on the southeasterly slope of a flat wooded hill. Residences lie west of the line with woodland dropping off slowly to the east and south, and level woodland to the north.

Bound is marked by a dressed sandstone monument showing 1.0 foot above ground. The low point in the road is opposite the Bound, and 75 feet to the north behind the gate the road curves sharply to the east.

Bound is located 16 feet west of the center of the traveled way at the westerly gate post of a gate maintained by the Metropolitan District Commission. There is fairly level woodland either side of the road which rises slightly to the north and east. There is a culvert under the road 36 feet north of the line.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.8 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "G Mass." on the north and "H Conn." on the south face. It is 9.6 feet long, set in excavation made in wet gravel. Monument was set July 2, 1907.


WOOD ROAD

From the intersection of Route 20 with a paved highway to the north in North Hollow, proceed northerly on paved highway for 75 feet and turn easterly on gravel road parallel to, above and just north of, Route 20. Proceed easterly about 250 feet to a gate across the road where it enters woodland at the foot of a steep rise. Proceed northeasterly 1,265 feet on wood road up steep hill in woodland to 50 feet south of fork in road at the top of the steep rise and Bound.

Bound is located 35 feet west of, and 6 feet above, the center of the wood road. It is 3 feet east of the center of the remains of the west and road wall. Woodland rises steeply to the northwest behind the Bound and falls away steeply to the southeast across the road. At the time of the 1997 Perambulation, there were chips on the north, south and east face of the Bound.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.8 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "G Mass." on the north and "H Conn." on the south face. It is 9.5 feet long, set in excavation made in sandy loam and gravel. Monument was set July 2, 1907.

PAVED HIGHWAY

From the intersection of Route 20 with a paved highway to the north in North Hollow, proceed northerly on paved highway to Bound at 0.2 mile at end of pavement in Connecticut.

Bound is located 46 feet east of the center of the traveled way, measured on the slope, at the top of a steep cut bank, about 20 feet above the highway and 10 feet south of a large white oak tree. East of the Bound, woodland rises to the northeast. West of the highway, woodland drops off to a brook and a concrete gauging weir of the Metropolitan District and rises gradually beyond the brook. Southeast corner of Bound is chipped. A C.H.D. monument is located one foot east of Bound.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 4.1 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "G Mass." on the north and "H Conn." on the south face. It is 9.4 feet long, set in excavation made in gravel. Monument was set July 2, 1907.

PAVED HIGHWAY

From the intersection of highways in the center of the village of West Hartland on Route 20, proceed northerly on Route 20 to intersection at 1.3 miles. Turn westerly onto Milo Coe Road and continue northerly on paved highway to Bound at 2.2 miles. Highway, after running straight and descending northerly, curves to the west 200 feet south of the Bound, runs straight past the Bound, curving west again 100 feet further north.

Bound is located 15 feet east of the center of the traveled way and 145 feet north of a culvert under the highway. Woodland slopes down east of the Bound and rises west of the highway. CL&P pole #6750 is 3 feet east of Bound. All top corners and edges of Bound are chipped. At the time of the 1997 Perambulation, the Bound was found tipped one inch east.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.2 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "G Mass." on the north and "H Conn." on the south face. It is 10.0 feet long, set in excavation made in sand. Monument was set July 12, 1907.

INTERIOR LINE SUMMIT

From the State Line on Milo Coe Road leading north from Route 20 to West Granville at Bound #147, proceed westerly on line following a well blazed survey line and line cutting along the south side of the Granville Forest 600 feet to Bound.

Bound is located at the flat line summit of the northerly spur of a wooded hill. It is 25 feet, S 25 degrees W from a 12-inch beech tree with a twisted trunk and 25 feet N 25 degrees E from a 12-inch hemlock. The clearing for a natural gas pipe line laid in 1952, running north and south, lies 75 feet west of the Bound. Woodland is level to the south, dropping away gently in other directions. Bound has a large chip on northwest top corner and edge.

Bound is marked by a dressed sandstone monument showing 1.1 feet above ground. It is 7 inches by 12 inches in section with the east and west edges of the top cut off, 3 inches back by 4 inches down, with a ½ inch drill hole 1 inch deep, 2 inches east of center of top, and is lettered "M State Line 1803" on the north and "C State Line 1803" on the south face. It is 4.9 feet long, set in excavation made in gravelly loam and ledge. Monument was set July 13, 1907.

ABANDONED ROAD

From the Village of West Hartland at the intersection of Route 20 and West Street, proceed northwesterly on West Street to intersection 1148 (Dish Mill and Stillman Road) east of Howells Pond at 1.4 miles. Continue northerly on paved highway (Stillman Road) changing to Wood Road at 1.8 miles to a closed gate at 1.9 miles. Proceed northerly on Wood Road for 4500 feet to Bound. Road passes a flat summit 70 feet south of line, descends slightly northerly and flattens out opposite Bound.

Bound is located 27 feet east of the center of the road and 7 feet west of the east road wall. Woodland rises gradually to the east and descends more abruptly west of the road to a laurel swamp. Bound has a small chip on top southeast corner.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.8 feet above ground. It is lettered "1906" on the west, "G Mass." on the north and "H Conn." on the south face. It is 9.8 feet long, set in excavation made in sandy loam and hardpan. Monument was set July 12, 1907

From the State Line on the abandoned road (Stillman Road) running north from intersection 1148 east of Howells Pond, at Bound #149, proceed westerly on line 380 feet down hill through laurel tangle to Bound in swamp.

Bound is located about 140 feet west of the east edge of a wooded and ferned swamp. Bound has a large chip on top northeast corner.

Bound is marked by a regulation granite monument showing 3.7 feet above ground. It is lettered "G 1906" on the east, "T" on the west, "MASS" on the north and "H CONN" on the south face. It is 9.7 feet long, set in excavation made 9 feet in bog and peat, the lower 4 feet filled with rock for a base and the monument set in concrete. Monument was set July 19, 1907

The dates "1920 and 1943" have been rough cut on the west face.
