<u>Very Important Note</u>: CTDEEP accepts CTDOT to submits Stormwater General Permit, as "Locally Approvable" rather than "Locally Exempt". Locally Approvable projects will require two Professional Engineer review signatures - Design Professional and Qualified Professional (QPE). These cannot be the same person, and if the project has more than 15 acres of disturbance, the QPE cannot work for the same firm as the Preparer/Filer.

Consultant engineer(s) are likely to have roles of Filer, Reviewer, Design Professional and Qualified Professional. Also include the DOT Consultant Design Project Engineer(s) with a Reviewer role.

The "Design Professional" and "Qualified Professional" roles will be for Consultant reviewers that have their PE license and will <u>both</u> digitally sign the ezfile registration after its final review. (Please note that once the Stormwater registration is "signed" by the Design Professional or Qualified Professional, <u>no</u> one can edit the filing or else these signatures will be erased. DEEP has this occur deliberately so no changes can be made to the filing after it has been signed.)

Following signatures by the Design Professional and Qualified Professional, the application will be submitted to the District Engineer through EPC. The District Engineer will be the one who will digitally sign the registration and formally submit the registration to DEEP. All DOT District Engineers have signed Subscriber Agreements with DEEP to have the authority to electronically sign <u>and</u> submit the ezfiling. Consultant reviewers (Design Professional and Qualified Professional) do <u>not</u> need a Subscriber Agreement since they are only signing the ezfiling, not submitting it.

<u>To all the ezfile filers</u>- Please include the State Project number on the same line as the "name of the site" ("Form Info" screen-Step 2.1 of 2.7). This way the State Project number will be included on the invoice when it is sent to Finance to be paid. Additionally, please include the specific district general mailbox (<u>DOT.ConstrD1@ct.gov</u>, <u>DOT.ConstrD2@ct.gov</u>, <u>DOT.ConstrD3@ct.gov</u>, or <u>DOT.ConstrD4@ct.gov</u>, <u>DOT.ConstrD5@ct.gov</u>) in any email correspondence regarding the review of the Stormwater filing.

Once the Stormwater registration has been reviewed, signed and submitted to DEEP, please make sure a copy of the application and Pollution Control Plan gets included in the Contract for processing. (No signatures or PE stamp needed.)
