## TRANSACTIONS AND DETERMINATIONS:

The meeting was held to provide the community with an opportunity to learn about the proposed project, and to have an open discussion of any views and comments they have concerning the proposed improvements.

Tracey Brais gave an introduction and overview, and Michael Jacovino followed with an in-depth Powerpoint presentation. Mr. Jacovino discussed the proposed steel repairs, strip, patch, membrane and pavement (SPMO) on I-95, and possible bridge fender system work.

Some temporary off-peak lane and shoulder closures will be needed to mill and pave I-95, and to replace the deck joints. Short term detours of local traffic are possible below the bridge. Access will always be available to the properties below and adjacent to the bridge. The work within the navigation channel will require coordination with the United States Coast Guard.

The project is anticipated to start field work early in the 2026 construction season; however, it is possible this will be pushed out one season pending final permitting requirements.

Ms. Brais thanked the public and she reminded them that they could submit comments and questions during the two-week comment period.
