

Rehabilitation // Bridge No. 00980A // State Project No. 0063-0734

History and Facts

Bulkeley Bridge:

- Stone masonry & reinforced concrete arch carrying I-84
- Built in 1906 (Cost \$3 million)
- Widened in 1964
- One of the oldest structures on the Interstate system
- Largest stone masonry arch bridge by surface area in the State of Connecticut



Bridge is approximately 1175 feet long by 121 feet wide



Existing Conditions

<u>Condition Rating</u> – a judgement of a bridge component condition in comparison to its original as-built condition, used to provide an overall characterization of the general condition of the component being rated.

Bridge Condition Ratings

Scale: 1 to 9

- 9 Excellent
- 8 Very Good
- 7 Good
- 6 Satisfactory
- 5 Fair
- 4 Poor
- 3 Serious
- 2 Critical
- 1 Imminent Failure



*Girders - Superstructure consists of stone masonry & concrete arches, stone masonry spandrel walls and arch rings. There is a longitudinal joint between the original 1908 masonry and 1964 concrete extension of the arches.



Project Purpose and Need

Purpose:


Bring the Structure back to a "State of Good Repair"

Needs:

- Address substandard parapets/barriers at median & North side of I-84 Westbound
- Replace wearing surface
- Clean bridge scuppers
- Replace roadway luminaires with modern energy efficient LED fixtures
- Repair underlying concrete pavement
- Repair substructure deterioration (above and below water line)
- Seal / Repair cracks
- · Clean efflorescence and remove graffiti
- Reconstruct upper portion of Northwest retaining wall
- Seal concrete surface from deicing salts




Plan View - West






Plan View - East

Environmental Impacts and Anticipated Permits

ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES:

- Connecticut River is a Tidal River System
- Located within an NDDB area (December 2023)
- Endangered species: Northern Long-Eared Bat & Monarch Butterfly (no critical habitats are identified)
- Not within an Aquifer Protection area

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS:

- Temporary and permanent wetland impacts are not anticipated.
 - Impacts will be further analyzed during final design

ANTICIPATED PERMITS:

- CTDOT Flood Management Certification (General)
- USCG Construction Letter
- USACE Section 404 PCN
- USACE Section 408 (levee)
- CT DEEP Certificate of Permission
- CT DEEP Boating Marker Permit

*Coordination with DEEP Fisheries ongoing; OEP to coordinate with NMFS and NOAA EFH/ESA




Anticipated Project Impacts - Traffic

CHA will perform a Regional Traffic Management Plan (TMP) to better understand and reduce the Traffic Impacts as much as possible.

Median Reconstruction Phase:

- Short-term shoulder and adjacent lane closures
- Duration: Approximately 6 months



North Barrier Construction Phase:

- Long-term closure (North shoulder & adjacent lane)
- Duration: Approximately 9 months
- Short-term ramp closures are anticipated when construction is being performed at both ends of the bridge.

<u>West End Parapet Reconstruction Phase:</u>

- Short-term shoulder and adjacent lane closure
- Duration: Approximately 2 months



Anticipated Project Impacts - Traffic (Cont.)

Replace Wearing Surface and Repair Concrete Pavement Phase:

- Daily/Long term lane closures with traffic drums (night work)
- Short-term off-peak ramp closures
- Duration: Approximately 4-6 months

Arch and Pier Repairs Phase:

- Work performed below the bridge with minimal traffic impacts.
- Will require access from embankments to river.
- Long term areas will be partitioned off for construction access.





Anticipated Project Impacts – Pedestrian / Bicycle

Pedestrian / Bicycle Accommodations

- Not identified as a route on the "On-Road Bicycle Planning Network"
- Bridge Preservation Project
 - No Significant Improvements are Recommended for Bicycles or pedestrians
- The Hartford Riverwalk is a constructed Statewide Multiuse Trail which runs beneath Bridge No. 00980A


<u>Pedestrian</u> / <u>Bicycle Impacts</u>

- Sidewalk over bridge will be closed to pedestrians during repair and cleaning operations across the bridge.
- Signed detour using the Founders Bridge will be in place.






I-91 Southbound Exit 30 Detour (I-91 SB to I-84 EB)



Advertising for Construction (ADV) – Fall 2025 Start of Construction – Spring 2027 Preliminary Anticipated Construction Duration = 3 years

Estimated Construction Cost

Total Estimated Construction Cost = \$23,900,000 10% State & 90% Federal Funds No Town Funds Required The cost and schedule are preliminary and are subject to change.
