I. INTRODUCTION

Soco Moving LLC dba Two Men and a Truck (hereinafter “transferor”) is the holder of Certificate No. HG-1792 last issued by the Department of Transportation (hereinafter “Department”) on October 11, 2017, authorizing, subject to such regulations and conditions as the Department may from time to time prescribe, to transport property for hire as a motor common carrier over irregular routes as follows: Household goods within the State of Connecticut, between all points upon calls received at its headquarters in New Haven.

II. APPLICANTS' PROPOSAL

By joint application filed on August 2, 2021, given Docket No. 2108-S-65-HG, the applicants seek Department approval of the sale and transfer of the authority, granted under Certificate No. HG-1792, from the transferor to AntWall 13, LLC dba Two Men and a Truck Connecticut, (hereinafter “applicant”).

III. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. After a review of the transferor's records, it was determined that the transferor had bills of lading.
2. The transferee's financial statement indicates it is financially able to staff, equip and operate the household goods moving service transferred herein.
3. The required Connecticut State Police Criminal History Information Report, indicating the absence of any criminal records of the transferee, was filed with the application.
4. A copy of the purchase agreement was submitted with the application.

IV. CONCLUSION

Therefore, based upon the facts stated above, and pursuant to Section 13b-406, the Department hereby approves the sale and transfer of the authority granted under Certificate No. HG-1792 as proposed, to the transferee, AntWall 13, LLC dba Two Men and a Truck Connecticut. Following the approval of this sale and transfer, the transferor will retain no rights to the authority transferred and Certificate No. HG-1792 is hereby amended and reissued in the following form:

AntWall 13, LLC dba Two Men and a Truck Connecticut is hereby permitted and authorized, subject to such regulations and conditions as the department may from time to time prescribe, to transport property for hire as a motor common carrier over irregular routes as follows:

Household goods within the State of Connecticut, between all points upon calls received at its headquarters in New Haven.

The certificate holder must accept and transport property, as herein authorized in accordance with its tariff on file, for all persons who desire the service to the extent of the certificate holder's facilities at uniform rate for all similar service.

There shall be carried in each vehicle operated under this authority a copy of the certificate registration receipt by the Department.

The certificate shall remain in effect until it is amended, suspended or revoked by the Department. Failure of the certificate holder to maintain proper insurance and/or comply with all pertinent motor vehicle laws and other State statutes and/or rules, regulations and orders of the Department shall be considered sufficient cause to amend, suspend or revoke this certificate.

This certificate may not be sold or transferred until it has been operational for more than twenty-four (24) months. This certificate is transferrable only with the approval of the Department and is issued subject to compliance by the holder thereof with all motor vehicle laws of the State of Connecticut, and with such rules, regulations and orders as this Department may from time to time prescribe.

A memorandum of this certificate, bearing the seal of the Department, shall be kept conspicuously posted in the motor vehicle operated hereunder.
