


Service and Fare Equity Analysis (SAFE)

- In accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Circular 4702.1B:
 - CTDOT conducts an Equity Analysis of proposed fare changes or major service changes to determine if the changes will have a disparate impact on minority customers, or a disproportionate burden on low-income customers
 - CTDOT is required to analyze temporary major service changes that are expected to continue beyond twelve months; and any fare changes beyond six months



CTDOT SAFE Process





Service and Fare Equity Analysis (SAFE)

- CTDOT's FTA Title VI Program for FFY 2021- FFY 2023 defines its Major Service Change Policy as any service change meeting at least one of the following criteria:
 - Route restructuring actions resulting in at least a 20% change in overall route length
 - Service frequency changes that result in a 25% or more change in annual revenue vehicle miles (RVM). Annual RVMs are a compilation of weekday and weekend RVMs
 - A service change adding or reducing service to a fixed guideway station resulting in a greater than 25% change in service at the station
 - Service change actions resulting in at least a one-hour change in service span



Definition of Disparate Impact and Disproportionate Burden

- <u>Disparate Impact</u> refers to a facially neutral policy or practice that disproportionately affects members of a group identified by race, color, or national origin
- <u>Disproportionate Burden</u> refers to a neutral policy or practice that disproportionately affects low-income populations

Proposed Rail Service Changes

- New Haven Line
 - Monday-Thursday service is proposed to be reduced from 239 to 237 trains per day
 - Friday Service is proposed to be reduced from 241 to 233 trains per day
- New Canaan Line
 - Weekday service is proposed to be reduced from 41 to 39 trains per day
- Danbury Line
 - Weekday service is proposed to be reduced from 28 to 26 trains per day
- Shore Line East
 - Weekday service is proposed to be reduced from 23 to 16 trains per day

Major Rail Service Change & Findings

- Proposed service changes on the New Haven Line, New Canaan Line and Danbury Line did not trigger the major service change threshold
- Shore Line East schedule changes exceeded the major service change threshold
 - 30.4% proposed decrease in Monday Friday service
- There were no findings of disparate impact or disproportionate burden on Shore Line East



Proposed Rail Fare Changes

- MTA increased commuter railroad fares in the state of New York by approximately 4.5% on August 20, 2023
- An approximate 4.5% increase is proposed for Metro-North Railroad fares in Connecticut, CT*rail* Hartford Line and Shore Line East fares, excluding monthly school passes
 - The increase is applied to a base fare and individual fare media (monthly, 10-trip, etc.) change based on their discount rates
 - Each rail line/fare media would increase at a slightly different rate as the one-way fares increase in 25-cent increments
 - There were no findings of disparate impact or disproportionate burden in the proposed rail fare changes



Proposed Rail Fare Changes - Range of Increases

- Metro-North fares in CT (to/from Grand Central Terminal)
 - One-way tickets range \$0.50 to \$1.00 (\$0.25 to \$0.50 for off peak)
 - 10-trip peak tickets range \$5.00 to \$10.00
 - Monthly tickets range \$9.00 to \$18.00
- Shore Line East fares (to/from New Haven)
 - One-way tickets range \$0.25 to \$0.50
 - 10-trip tickets range \$2.00 to \$4.00
 - Monthly tickets range \$5.25 to \$10.50
- Hartford Line fares (to/from New Haven)
 - One-way tickets range \$0.25 to \$0.50 (\$0.75 to Springfield)
 - 10-trip tickets range \$2.00 to \$4.00
 - Monthly tickets range \$5.25 to \$10.50 (\$11.25 to Springfield)



MNR Rail Fare Change Examples

- Stamford to Grand Central Terminal
 - One-way \$15.25 (\$16.00 post-increase)
 - 10-trip peak \$152.50 (\$160.00 post-increase)
 - Monthly \$301.50 (\$315.00 post-increase)
- New Haven to Grand Central Terminal
 - One-way \$23.50 (\$24.50 post-increase)
 - 10-trip peak \$235.00 (\$245.00 post-increase)
 - Monthly \$450.00 (\$466.25 post-increase)
- New Haven to Bridgeport
 - One-way \$3.75 (\$4.00 post-increase)
 - 10-trip peak \$32.00 (\$34.00 post-increase)
 - Monthly \$68.75 (\$71.00 post-increase)



SLE Rail Fare Change Examples

New London to New Haven

- One-way \$10.25 (\$10.75 post-increase)
- 10-trip \$82.00 (\$86.00 post-increase)
- Monthly \$215.25 (\$225.75 post-increase)

Clinton to New Haven

- One-way \$5.75 (\$6.00 post-increase)
- 10-trip \$46.00 (\$48.00 post-increase)
- Monthly \$120.75 (\$126.00 post-increase)

Branford to Old Saybrook

- One-way \$4.50 (\$4.75 post-increase)
- 10-trip \$36.00 (\$38.00 post-increase)
- Monthly \$94.50 (\$99.75 post-increase)

Hartford to New Haven

- One-way \$8.00 (\$8.25 post-increase)
- 10-trip \$64.00 (\$66.00 post-increase)
- Monthly \$168.00 (\$173.25 post-increase)

Meriden to New Haven

- One-way \$4.75 (\$5.00 post-increase)
- 10-trip \$38.00 (\$40.00 post-increase)
- Monthly \$99.75 (\$105.00 post-increase)

Berlin to Springfield

- One-way \$8.00 (\$8.25 post-increase)
- 10-trip \$64.00 (\$66.00 post-increase)
- Monthly \$168.00 (\$173.75 post-increase)

- Types of Proposed Changes
 - Increased Service Frequency
 - Decreased Service Frequency
 - Route Restructuring
 - Route Elimination
 - Adding New Local/CTfastrak Routes



Proposed Bus Route Changes

- Proposed new bus routes
 - New Haven Division:
 - Route 216 (Northford/Wallingford/Meriden)
 - Route 262 (Orange Business District)
 - Hartford Division:
 - CT fastrak 125* (Hartford/Berlin Turnpike)
 - Replacing Routes 45X, 47B, 907, and dash
- *Route 125 would offer a wider overall service span than the four routes it is proposed to replace
 - Buses would operate on a more consistent schedule and serve more destinations around the Berlin Turnpike
 - Travel time on proposed Route 125 would be comparable to Route 47B and 10 minutes faster than Route 69





Proposed Bus Route Changes

- Increased service frequency
 - CTfastrak 144 (Wethersfield/Westfarms)
 - CTfastrak 153 (Elmwood/Copaco)
- Decreased span of service
 - Hartford dash
- Route restructuring
 - Route 69 (Capitol Avenue)
 - CTfastrak Route 102 (Hartford/New Britain/Bristol)
- Route elimination
 - Route 45X (Berlin Turnpike Flyer)
 - Route 47B (Berlin Turnpike)
 - CTfastrak 140 (CCSU Connector)
 - Route 907 (Newington Express)
 - Route 923 (Bristol Express)





Major Service Changes – Bus Routes

13 routes have proposed service changes

- 11 routes triggered the major service change threshold
 - Only Route 47B and CTfastrak 102 did not meet the major service change threshold

Bus Service SAFE Findings

- Express Route 907 had a finding of Disparate Impact
- This is a result of the proposed route elimination
 - Route 907 serves an area with a high concentration of minority populations
 - Mitigation: Replacement service would be provided by the new CT fastrak 125
- Dash had a finding of Disparate Impact and Disproportionate Burden
- This is a result of the reduction in days/hours of service, moving from a Monday – Friday schedule to a Thursday – Sunday schedule
 - Dash serves an area with a high concentration of minority and lowincome populations
 - Mitigation: From Monday to Wednesday, replacement bus service will be provided by the new CTfastrak 125



Reintroduction of Bus Fares & Findings

- All bus fares in Connecticut were suspended April 1, 2022 March 31, 2023
- Bus fare collection resumed statewide on April 1, 2023
 - Per federal guidance, this needed to be included in the Fare Equity Analysis

 There were no findings of disparate impact or disproportionate burden as a result of reinstituting fares



Next Steps

- CTDOT will review and consider all comments received during the public comment period and make changes to address those comments if needed. Comments and any changes will be included in the Final SAFE Analysis
- Once the Final SAFE Analysis is completed, a recommendation will go to the CTDOT Commissioner for review and approval
- Proposed Metro-North rail service changes, if approved, to take effect on October 29, 2023
- Proposed Shore Line East service changes, if approved, to take effect in late 2023 (date TBD)
- Proposed rail fare increases, if approved, to take effect on November 1, 2023
- Proposed bus service changes, if approved, to take effect on March 10, 2024
 - CTfastrak 102 changes to go into effect on November 5, 2023
- Additional communication and final schedules for rail and bus will be made available in advance of any changes
