1.0 Preliminaries

1.1 Call to Order/Roll Call 852am

1.2 Minutes

Meeting notes for April accepted with revision that they are meeting minutes.

1.3 Input from visitors

Bob Dickson of South Windsor - Concerned that DOT is not restriping all roadways to 11' lanes. DOT indicated they are not eradicating the existing pavement markings. They are only redoing where the roadways are being repaved/milled/overlaid. Town roadways may be different.

2.0 Old Business

Reviewed last month presentation on NV Greenway and Board provided support for the TIGER application with letter of support for TIGER application.

Discussed Farmington Heritage Trail - section in Southington and Plainville

CCRPA submitting a tiger grant application for engineering for designing the gaps in the trail in Southington and Plainville – separate funding pool for planning projects – not in direct competition with other projects.

Geographic distribution is a factor in the application process.

Previous studies were done but not satisfactory. Need some more creative thinking with the new plan.

Priorities for DOT support of pending TIGER applications - Naugatuck Greenway and

Eastern CT Freight/Rail improvements, possibly linking Worcester and New London and colleges along the route. But not necessarily Plainville/Southington.

TIGER likes projects with "Ladders of opportunity"

The Board will draft a letter of support for the CCRPA pending application for inclusion in the application.

The Board discussed support for the eastern ct DOT application to TIGER as well.

The Board to review a policy for evaluating requests for letters of support for projects, applications, etc. Put on agenda for next month. Issues to consider – competitive funding and TIGER applications. Not programmed funded projects.

CMAQ – might benefit from Board support letters – traditionally bike and ped projects haven't competed well against others.
