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2.0 Reports/Presentations

DOT Projects, News, Updates:

Gold star bridge – federal grant allows work on north bound span to be accelerated. Update on improving bike/ped access? Existing footprint of bridge deck – northbound side cannot sustain additional structure so bike ped access would need to be included within the existing structure.

SB side direction is being reviewed for bike/ped access improvement (widening from 5 ft. to 8 ft.), to be decided this winter whether the improved access will be on the NB or SB span. Sandy asked for a copy of the feasibility report for the SB as soon as it is completed.

Progress with new CS policy, update next month with Commissioner change, CS standing committee meeting. While the BPAB has not seen the draft yet, our input early on was instrumental in the development of the draft policy.

Update of Active Transportation Plan online map –stakeholder group? Negotiations completed with consultant, and start of project in February. How to expand bike network being considered, desire is for it to be data driven.

Community Connectivity grant program (CCGP), round 5 coming out soon, early February with 6 months allowed for applications to be submitted

Expectation is annual funding, though solicitations may not be annual.

Also launching TRIP for general improvements for rural areas, applications due in February. This is similar to CCGP but is not focused solely on bike ped improvements.

Bulkeley Bridge – any photos? No update except that additional striping delayed until spring.

RAISE Grants – question on whether CTDOT will administer the CRCOG grant award. This should be determined by next month.

Neil noted that a DOT rep attended a town meeting on road safety, this was extremely helpful, kudos to DOT. The RSA to CCGP process is very important, would be good if CCGP allowed funds to be used for design.

Suggestion to include legislation by CTDOT for next month HB 5917 – Vision Zero recommendations bill, public hearing on Monday 1/30 at Capitol, testimony support requested

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Putnam Bridge bike trail approach construction update and bridge deck issue – next month

3.0 Old Business

3.1 Annual Report

Street project documentary noted, with some very effective footage related to the blind spots in front of SUV's. Great work, Amy and Watch for Me CT! CTWatchForMe funding, Sandy asked about funding that DOT indicated went to AARP. Amy clarified that the additional funding was used to get more media buys for the Words to Live By campaign, which focused upon senior citizens.

Need for updating the drivers manual for new legislation, The Vision Zero legislation speaks about a video that will be developed to highlight the changes. Chuck Harlowe who served on the VZ committee that recommended the video said the idea was to set it up so that anyone going to the DMV site (to register a vehicle, etc.) would have to view the video. It was noted that the new laws relative to bike ped safety could be elements of the safety campaign.

Importance of the safety campaign to affect behavior, and can provide more bang for the buck. To date, the bike ped safety messaging is not ubiquitous, not like the slow down for work zones campaign of a number of years ago. Use UCONN TRSC information for safety data. It is more up to date than the UCONN crash data repository (some police depts. never report to the data base.)

Add recommendation on focusing on pedestrian fatality trend with education/behavior and infrastructure. Might note that last year DOT was in penalty for not achieving g pedestrian safety improvements goals. This year is likely to be the same based upon 2022 goals. Also, note that our % of motor vehicle crash deaths that are pedestrian is higher than the national average.

Should note what the Board does (monthly meetings, testimony, support letters)

VZ recommendations should be an appendix not in front of report with specific recommendations highlighted in the report.

Report needs to be more readable, make sure the major points jump out. All to send updated revised report early next week for finalization
