2.0 Reports/Presentations

Bill Veronesi

Natasha Fatu, CT DOT, Traffic Safety Engineering, introduction of Vulnerable Road User Assessment tool. (presentation attached). Next month would like to discuss this topic further. The end result of this work will be a set of strategies designed to reduce injuries and fatalities for vulnerable road users. An illumination study will require a lot of fieldwork. A raised intersection/crosswalk study is underway. A study of the safety of no turn on red is underway. Where the VRU assessment refers to a pedestrian hybrid beacon, this is the signal type that used to be called HAWK. VRU Assessment is due November 15.

Discussion: Overnight flashing operation eliminates pedestrian phases, DOT plans to eliminate overnight flashing operations, although to do this, there needs to be artery detection. Vehicle mix likely has had an impact upon VRU safety; DOT guidelines for subdivision streets are outdated, should be updated or removed. Pedestrian crossings at commercial driveways can be a particular problem for pedestrians. Education is especially needed for VRUs.

DOT Reports/Updates

ConnDOT Executive Order discussed regarding new controlling design criteria for bicycles, pedestrians and transit. It is in effect and any comments can be provided for consideration. Some discussion of whether this applies to LOTCIP funded projects. DOT says this was not the intent.

- •Office of Outdoor Recreation within DEEP (supported by BWCT and CT Greenways Council) Other states do this, including Colorado
- •Treatment of sidewalks on state roadways this should be changed to Infrastructure for Vulnerable Users on State Roadways. Note in other states, state roads end at municipal boundaries, so we may have it somewhat better here. Need way to clarify what we are looking for. The new design criteria may address this in part. Continuing discussion
- •TOD legislation previously this has been unsuccessful, perhaps because it focused upon zoning matters, and those may not be the real barriers to TOD. Barriers might be infrastructure, lack of capacity at municipal level. Lack of funding at municipal level to enable.
