The purpose of this project is to create a new bridge with an improved structure design and hydraulic performance that will increase the safety of all travelers.

Right-of-way impacts associated with this project will take place on private properties and will consist of temporary construction easement for access, grading, and water handling.

Construction is anticipated to begin in 2028. The estimated construction cost for this project is approximately \$4 million with 80% federal funds and 20% state funds.
