This open house is being held to provide the community with an opportunity to learn about the proposed project and allow an open discussion of any views and comments concerning the proposed improvements.

The purpose of this project is to improve pedestrian connections across freeway ramps.

Right-of-way impacts include minor acquisitions, temporary construction easements, and rights to grade and construct driveways.

Construction is expected to start spring 2028, subject to available funding and right-of-way acquisition. The estimated cost is \$3 million, with 80% federal funds and 20% state funds.
