The purpose of this meeting is to provide the community with an opportunity to learn about the proposed project and allow an open discussion of any views and comments concerning the proposed improvements. A Q&A session will immediately follow the presentation.

The project aims to replace the aging traffic signal infrastructure at intersections along the route by installing new traffic signal equipment and replacing the existing traffic signal system.

Right-of-way impacts are expected to be minimal around new signal equipment and sidewalks at some project intersections. New sidewalks may also be installed at some project intersections.

Construction is expected to start in fall 2027, depending on funding, right-of-way acquisition, and permits. The estimated cost is \$9 million, with 100% state funds.
