The purpose of this meeting is to provide the community with an opportunity to learn about the proposed project and allow an open discussion of any views and comments concerning the proposed improvements. A Q&A session will immediately follow the presentation.

The purpose of this project is to reduce congestion and congestion crashes at the intersection of Route 32, State Route 693, and Old Norwich Road by reconfiguring the lanes for additional capacity and upgrading the existing traffic signals.

Right-of-way impacts are limited to rights to reconstruct and grade residential driveways within the project limits.

Construction is expected to start fall 2027, depending on funding and permits. The estimated cost is \$11 million with 80% federal funds and 20% state funds.
