Can I join the program?

#### Yes, if you:

- Live in Connecticut
- Need **Breast and Cervical Health Screening** and
  - You have (or have had) breasts or a cervix or need preventative breast or cervical cancer screenings.
  - You are 21 to 64 years of age
- Are 65+ not enrolled in Medicare Part B. You may be eligible to join.
- Need **Heart Health Screening** and
  - You are 35-64 years of age
- Need **Colon Health Screening** and
  - You are 45 years of age and over
- Meet the income eligibility guidelines at our website.

### CT Breast & Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program

The Connecticut Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (CBCCEDP) is a screening program available throughout Connecticut for medically underserved residents.

The objective of the program is to increase breast and cervical cancer screening and diagnostic and treatment referral services. All services are offered free of charge through the Connecticut Department of Public Health's contracted health care providers located statewide.

#### You are eligible for program services if:

- You have, or have had, breasts or a cervix
- You are a transgender woman or nonbinary person with past or current gender affirming hormone treatment
- You are a transgender man or nonbinary person and have not had a bilateral mastectomy or total hysterectomy
- You are 40–64 years of age for a mammogram and 21–64 years of age for a clinical breast exam & Pap test
- You are 35–39 years old with symptoms and/or specific risk factors for breast cancer
- You have limited income, and
- You have no health insurance, or
- You have health insurance that excludes routine Pap tests and/or mammograms, or
- You have an insurance deductible of \$1,000 or more, or
- You are not enrolled in Medicare Part B

### CT Well-Integrated Screening & Evaluation for WOMen Across the Nation (WISEWOMAN) Program\*

*\*Although the program title emphasizes women, this program is available to transgender and nonbinary individuals.*

In addition to receiving breast and cervical services, individuals enrolled in the CBCCEDP, aged 35–64, can be screened for heart disease.

This program provides people who are found at risk for heart disease a chance to participate in nutrition and physical activity interventions which will help decrease their risk of heart disease.

#### You are eligible for program services if:

- You are enrolled in the CT Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (CBCCEDP),
- You are 35–64 years of age,
- You have limited income, and
- You have no health insurance, or
- Your insurance does not cover routine blood pressure and cholesterol screenings



### CT Colorectal Cancer Control Program

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has funded the Connecticut Colorectal Cancer Control Program (CCRCCP) to reduce disparities in colorectal cancer burden, screening, and access to care by providing follow-up diagnostic colonoscopies for a limited number of program-eligible people.

You may be eligible to receive a free diagnostic colonoscopy or follow-up colonoscopy to remove polyps. Polyps are growths that can turn into cancer if they are not removed.

#### You are eligible for program services if:

- You are 45 years of age and over,
- You received a positive test result from another colorectal cancer (CRC) screening option such as fecal immunochemical testing (FIT) and fecal occult blood testing (FOBT) or an initial colonoscopy not paid for by the CCRCCP,
- You have limited income, and you have no health insurance or,
- You have health insurance that excludes a diagnostic exam, or,
- You have insurance with a deductible of \$1,000 or more
