

## How to Locate an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) Certified Firm

## LEAD POISONING PREVENTION PROGRAM • APRIL 2020

As of April 22, 2010, the EPA <u>requires</u> firms that conduct renovations, remodeling or paint removal activities on residential houses, apartments, and child-occupied facilities built before 1978, to:

- be certified as a certified "certified firm" with the EPA,
- have trained employees in the use of lead-safe work practices, and
- use lead-safe work practices that minimize occupants' exposure to lead hazards must be followed.

The contactors or a contractor's employee <u>must</u> take an EPA-approved 8-hour training course in order to obtain certification and become a "certified firm".

## To locate a certified firm with EPA:

- 2) Select "Renovator", complete the form on the website then click on the "Search" button (a list of firms will be generated).
  - \*A Dust Sampling Technician certificate is <u>not</u> recognized in Connecticut. Those individuals who complete dust samplings <u>must</u> be either a CT-licensed Lead Inspector or licensed Lead Inspector Risk Assessor.

**Note:** If a company claims to be an EPA-certified RRP firm but does not appear on the website, please:
